

#### Landscape Committee News

It is March, and March 1st is actually the first day of meteorological spring. Tell Mother Nature that and see if she listens. Of course, this is not the time to be out planting in the garden beds. It is much too cold and wet. To do work in the beds would do nothing except compact the soil and drainage would be impeded. It is time to think about planting some color in a pot on the porch or in railing boxes. The flowers that will withstand a cold snap include the pansies and violas. They can be found in the garden centers.

Do not try to work the soil unless it is dry enough that it will not stick together and form a ball in the palm of your hand. This is a good indication that the soil

is too wet and will only smother the roots of the plants. Once it is dry it is time to work some granular fertilizer into the soil.

Daffodils are starting to emerge from the soil even though it may seem almost too cold for them. Hope you didn't plant tulip bulbs last fall. When the deer find them in bloom they could be gone overnight. They are a favorite flower of deer.


Indoor plants will need your attention. Check for any infestations of spider mites and aphids. Use insecticidal soap to remove them and then spray with tepid water until you don't see them anymore. Consider transplanting houseplants into new soil to refresh the plant or divide one to keep or give to a friend. Make sure that the pots have been scrubbed clean and the drainage holes are open. Use soilless mixes to prevent compaction of the soil.

Tools should be cleaned and sharp and ready to use as soon as the weather breaks.

Do not forget yourself this spring. Start slow and easy. We have not used those muscles necessary to do yard work. Slow and easy every day and you will enjoy your time in the garden.

#### **Community Manager Update**

- Directory and Emergency Contact Information:
  - Please provide the Information Center with any changes to phone numbers, email addresses or names. Contact Forms are available at the Lodge on the table below the photo wall and at the Information Center. Accurate information is key when we send out email blasts, Neighbor Helping Neighbor requests or other communication.
- **Abitibi Paper Recycling Bin:** Thank you to all residents who use the paper/cardboard recycling bin in the RV Parking Lot! In addition to reducing waste at our local landfills, Avenbury receives payment for material placed in the bin. Please place paper and crushed cardboard ONLY in the bin. **NO PLASTIC BAGS OF ANY KIND SHOULD BE LEFT IN OR AROUND THE BINS.**
- **Brightview:** Workers will continue to clean up Home Owner beds and common areas removing leaves, cutting grasses and perennials throughout the Spring. Brush hogging of meadow areas will begin as weather and ground conditions allow. If we receive snow fall more than 2", Brightview will be out to clear the asphalt streets, all driveways and front walks and one side of the public sidewalks on Pembrooke and Nottingham. If you wish to apply a product for traction to your driveway or front walk, please use a non-salt product like Ice Melt or kitty litter. The HOA does not apply any type of ice melt product to driveways or walks, so please be careful while outside in winter weather conditions. Also, please report any snow damage to the Information Center by April 1st.
- **Geese:** As the weather warms up, we will see more geese on the property. Per the Rules and Regulations, bird feeders are restricted to the rear Homeowner beds. No bird feeders or ground feeding is allowed in any Common Area. Avenbury Lakes has a monthly contract with Ohio Geese Control to reduce the numbers of geese that live here full time while not harming them.
- Avenbury Annual Inspection Letters: In February and March, many residents will receive letters from the Information Center regarding typically minor issues that were identified during the 2019 Annual Inspection. The letters are meant to be clear, but if you have any questions about what we are asking for, feel free to call us and we will clarify it with you. Thank you for your attention to this matter, we really appreciate it!
- Architectural Committee Requests: Items that need approval prior to installation are listed in Section M. Architecture in the Rules and Regs and can also be found in detail in the Standards Book at the Information Center. As a reminder, approvals are needed for: satellite dishes, security lights, fences, awnings, handrails, generators, window sash replacement, sola tubes, overhead garage doors and basement window wells. The Committee members are very quick to respond to requests and can answer any question you may have. We also strongly discourage the use of nails or screws through vinyl siding or metal siding trim for any reason.
- **Metal Recycling Event:** Due to unforeseen circumstances, the annual April event has been canceled for 2020. Hopefully we will be able to continue in 2021.


