Maintenance of the grounds and facilities and HOA business decisions must continue during the shutdown.

As of May 1st, the Governor has opened some businesses, HOWEVER, community centers and senior centers were not included in that order. For those residents who do not have internet access, we ask that you please call the Information Office at 440-937-9441 and leave a message. If you have questions concerning The Breeze or events, we ask that you leave Patty Hales (Lodge Administrator) your message by calling the Lodge at 440-937-9387 (Ext.#1). We are checking emails and voicemails daily from our homes and will return your messages as soon as we can.

As we all listen to the news, we can see that this will be our NEW normal for the foreseeable future. As the weather begins to warm up and we get out and about more, we ask that everyone continue to adhere to the social distancing guidelines. Please check the **avenburylakes.com** website every few days for the latest news and share that with your neighbors who may not have access. For those without internet access, perhaps a friend or family member can check for you and keep you up on the latest news.

Landscape Committee News

It is so hard to imagine what it will be like for the 2020 spring and summer growing season. We must think positive and enjoy all the wonders the seasons have to offer. Growing plants is an enjoyment we can all look forward to. The rains of April will certainly bring the May flowers. The chores in the yard need to be done. Get out there and soak up the beautiful warm days.



It is time to remove the yellowing foliage of the daffodils and hyacinths. Do not remove them until they have really died back. The dead leaves are the food for next year's blossoms. The tulips may still be in bloom. Wait for them to die back as well.

Watch for the bugs on your shrubs and the emerging buds of all your plants. This is when the eggs hatch and the plants become their dinner plates.

We can think about planting our annuals after the danger of frost has passed. In our region, that is usually after May 15th. Stay up on the latest weather predictions. The emerging perennials will be just fine. A good dose of a long term fertilizer can be applied and worked into the top of the soil, if you have not already done so in April.

It is time to move those houseplants outdoors if that is what you like to do. Remember they are also a new treat for the many critters we have at Avenbury. If the plants have become leggy and a little wild, trim them back and start to feed them. You might experience leaf drop at first, but they will recover if they are given water, food and light.

Stay safe and enjoy the outdoors while we can.

Garden Plot Payments and Information



For those who wish to utilize the garden plots or renew your plot for the 2020 season, you may drop your payment off in the mail slot at the Information Office starting May 1st. We would appreciate all payments be received by **Friday, May 15th**. For first time users there is a \$25.00 Security Deposit and a \$25.00 plot fee that is due. For returning users there is a \$25.00 plot fee that is due. Avenbury Mixed Golf League

Community Manager Update

• Closures due to COVID-19:

The Lodge and the Information Office will continue to be closed through May, 2020. In addition, the Outdoor Pool will NOT open on Memorial Day Weekend. At this point we are hoping for a mid-June opening dependent on State Mandates,



Hastings schedule and the Board's decision. Resident health and safety remain top priorities during the COVID-19 Pandemic and we appreciate your patience during this difficult time.

• Neighbor Helping Neighbor:

N.H.N. services have been suspended indefinitely due to COVID-19.

• Gutter Cleaning:

Spring gutter cleaning for those on the gutter cleaning list, will begin in late May and continue into June. This service is weather dependent and occurs after tree blossoms have fallen, so dates are approximate. Please maintain 6' social distancing guidelines while work is in progress.

Road Work:

Streets that were paved in 2019 will need to be sealed this year. This includes Buckingham and the east end of Manchester including the RV Circle and the large Manchester Circle. Driveways will also be sealed in those areas. When specific dates are available, they will be posted to the website **(avenburylakes.com)** and all affected residents will be given flyers with important information regarding parking, time frames and other info. All work is weather dependent, so dates are subject to change. As always, information will be available by calling the Information Center (440-937-9441).

• Landscape News:

Mowing began in April and will continue through the fall. Days and streets may vary depending on weather conditions. Please do not use your irrigation systems 24 hours prior to a mow day if possible. The latest news will be posted to the website and residents can call the office with any questions.

• Mulch:

Is scheduled to be installed at homeowner and common area beds prior to Memorial Day beginning the week of May 11 (back up date the week of May 18th). Please close windows and move breakable items in your homeowner beds prior to the dates. See the website for specific days.

• Irrigation Systems:

If you use a contractor to turn on your irrigation system, please make sure they thoroughly check the entire system!! We have had several instances where sprinkler heads were buried under the ground causing very wet turf areas leading to damage from lawn mowers. The contractor should also check your timer. Per Brightview, the best time to water is around 2 or 3 AM for about 10 minutes 3 days per week (based on a typical year's rainfall). Another possible addition to your system is a "Solar Sync". This device automatically turns your system on and off based on real time weather conditions rather than a standard timer schedule. In other words, your sprinklers will not come on while it is raining. This device will save you money on your water bill, paying for itself in no time.

• Updates:

Remember to check the website for the latest news or call the Info Center (937-9441). Dates are subject to change based on weather conditions and other factors.

Roof Replacement Project:

Due to COVID-19, roof replacements to be completed this year on Montague, Roxbury and Detroit will be postponed until June at the earliest. We will provide updates to homeowners affected and will post to the website. Homeowners will be given flyers with detailed information prior to the beginning of any work each week. Information will also be available on the website and by calling the Information Center.

• Landscape Beds Reminder:

If you are re-doing your homeowner beds, please submit a Modification Form to the Landscape Committee if you are removing or adding a tree, removing more than 3 plants or have questions regarding the Approved Plant List.

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Face Mask Information



Several volunteers here at Avenbury Lakes are making cloth face masks and donating them to nursing homes and hospitals.

In April the Centers for Disease Control strongly recommended wearing cloth face coverings in public settings where other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain (e.g., grocery stores and

pharmacies), especially in areas of significant community-based transmission. Cloth face masks used in conjunction with staying home, hand washing, and social distancing have already done much to slow the spread of the COVID-19 virus in Ohio. The CDC also advises the use of simple cloth face coverings to help people who may have the virus and do not know it from transmitting it to others.
