They get a warning the first time and their name is placed on a list. Tickets are issued for repeat offenses. Additionally, let us know at the Information Center.

- **Brightview News:** Mowing is continuing weekly. Feel free to call the Info Center with any questions or complaints. Remember the schedule is subject to change based on the weather. Pruning of new growth will be on going this month. Grub treatment was applied in late June. Other areas will receive enhancements and re-seeding where trees were removed last year.
- Street Work: Crack sealing, seal coating and street repairs were completed in June and early July.
- Roof Replacements: Final Touch, our roofing contractor, began replacements on 6/15/20 on Detroit Road. From there, they moved onto Roxbury and once that street is complete, they will start on Montague. Replacements will continue through the summer. Residents affected will receive flyers with specific instructions the week before work begins. Please stay away from work areas while the crews are on the property. Updates will be posted to the website and residents can call the Info Center with any questions or concerns. Work had been delayed due to the COVID-19 pandemic but may now resume per State of Ohio guidelines.
- Other work: Aqua Doc is actively treating the ponds for algae. Work Orders, emails and voicemails continue to be addressed as received. \*Work Orders or complaints should be in writing and either sent via email or left in the door at the Info Center. Please do not reply to email blasts, we will not receive those.\*
- **COVID-19 ISSUES:** The Outdoor Pool/Spa and the Exercise Room are open for limited days and times beginning June 16, 2020. The limitations are due to State Mandate requirements and the associated costs to the HOA in complying with those Mandates. The Lodge and the Indoor Pool remain closed currently, except for the Bathrooms during open Outdoor Pool and Exercise Room days/hours. #### Landscape Committee News



Here we are in the middle of summer. The time has been going fast, even though how we spend this time has changed so drastically. In July the garden and beds around your home should be looking healthy and the plants should be starting to show signs of blooming. We have been in a June of

swinging temperatures that does play a part in the growth cycle. This June has been good as far as rainfall goes. Very little watering has been needed. We hope that all of you with sprinkling systems have them turned on, as we head into the dry part of the summer. Make sure you are using the recommended cycles of every other day, early morning and 15 minute intervals. We know that this has to be adjusted to your mowing day and that can be confusing.

We would like to take this opportunity to answer some questions that were brought to our attention during the meetings that were held in January and February.

Amending the soil: What does that mean? In the spring, it means that we are adding nutrients that have been depleted by the previous year's growing season. To do that, we need to be adding additional topsoil, and a natural additive such as peat moss. Some granular long-lasting fertilizer over the entire garden area can be added as well at this time. You should end up with a loose soil that is easy to plant in. This may not happen the first time you do it, but over time you will notice a difference in the texture of the ground.

As we put new plants in the ground it is advisable that we dig deeper than needed and add the same nutrients to the soil. As always if you have questions you can ask the Landscape Committee for help.

Aeration of the soil will be advised in the near future at a cost to you. In this area of the country it is usually done in the late summer or early fall. If you have never done this or it has been a few years you might want to consider investing in the process. It is done with a machine that digs holes in your lawn and pulls plugs out to allow the root system to grow and water and fertilizer to permeate that root system in these compacted areas.

Each month we will try and answer more of your questions. In the meantime if you are going to change your landscaping in any way it is always good to check with the Committee or the Office so that the correct procedure is followed. This will save you time in getting the correct information from the very beginning of your project.

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


