HOA BOARD PRIORITIES FOR 2021

The HOA board is setting the following priorities for 2021 in an effort to:

- ~ insure prudent use of all funds;
- ~ maintain the appearance of this community;
- ~ minimize for residents the impact of increasing costs; and
- ~ enhance efficiency of community operations.

1) Continue with Phase V of the re-roofing project to include 33 homes on Nottingham.

2) Continue restoration of the basin embankments to proper design.

3) Conduct frequent interactions among board, staff, ad hoc committee and contractors to monitor maintenance of the basins, fountains, and culverts.

4) Improve landscape and snow removal activities through enhanced communication and controlled scheduling.

 5) Develop a tree management program based upon the evaluation conducted by Bartlett Tree Experts with the goal of proactively reviewing health of community trees to avoid costly losses and replacements.

> 6) Determine phased plans for repairs of wood bridges, the floating dock, and culverts around the retention basins.

7) Consider a Bylaws amendment to allow votes by mail in the absence of an annual meeting due to unusual circumstances such as the COVID-19 prohibition of mass gatherings.

8) Monitor COVID restrictions/ guidelines and make adjustments accordingly; increase amenities available to residents as soon as we safely can do so.





COMMUNITY MANAGERS REPORT

• **SOLICITATION:** If you do not want to answer the door to salespeople, please contact the City of Avon and register your address as "NO SOLICITATION". They will give you a sticker to attach to your front door stating, "NO SOLICITATION". If a salesperson ignores the sticker, you should report them to the Avon Police Department. The Lodge and Information Center are "No Solicitation" areas.

- **COUPON BOOKS:** For those residents using coupons for their Maintenance Fees, the new books were mailed in December. If you no longer want to use a coupon book, please call Lawrence Community Management Group at (440-937-2800) to find out how to set up an automatic payment. Beginning in 2021 and in future years, coupon books will be available for \$15.00. This is a cost saving measure for all Avenbury residents as it reduces an HOA expense.
- **2021 MAINTENANCE FEES:** As previously noted, the fee will be increased \$5.00 beginning January 1, 2021. If you have Auto Pay through your bank, you must notify them of the increase to avoid late fees. If you have Auto Pay through Lawrence Community Management Group, the fee will automatically be increased, and you do not have to do anything.
- SNOW REMOVAL: For the latest news, please check the Avenbury Lakes website or call the Information Center M-F before 2PM (937-9441). Snow fall must exceed 2" before snow removal activities begin. Please DO NOT place Holiday decorations including extension cords where they may be damaged by snow removal equipment. This includes front walks, porches, driveways and driveway edges. Brightview will make every effort to clear the snow as soon as possible. In the event of a large snowstorm, as we had in November, it may take more than one day to clear all of the snow in all areas.
