Reduce, Reuse, Recycle

Due to restrictions associated with the pandemic, we will not be recruiting volunteers to help with an Avenbury Lakes metal recycling project this year. However, in accordance with our approach toward conservation, we encourage residents to recycle whenever possible. The following two facilities are good options.

Lorain County Recycling at 1815 Elyria Avenue in Lorain (440-244-3345) LorainMetals.com. Hours are Mon-Fri 8-4:30 and Saturday, 8-11:30. They pay for all types of scrap metal. There are no special rules regarding the pandemic.

Lorain County Collection Center at 540 S. Abbe Road in Elyria (440-329-5440) <u>LorainCounty.us/SolidWaste</u>.Hours are Wednesday 12-6 and Saturday 9-3. Two other sites (Lorain and Grafton) accept tires with some restrictions. Call (440) 329-5111 for details.

~ Beginning this month, **Ohio Geese Control** will be back on the property with their trained dogs gently hazing the geese into leaving the property. This is an important time of the year for this activity discouraging them from feeling comfortable enough that they nest here later in the year.

 $\sim {\bf Brightview}:$ As the weather allows, Brightview will cut down the ornamental grasses in homeowner and HOA mulch beds and brush

hog the common meadow areas. Brightview began working on this task in January. They will also continue with mulch bed clean up throughout the winter whenever possible. Snow removal activities will be conducted when snow accumulation exceeds 2". ~ **Bartlett Tree Experts**: In October and November of 2020, the Board contracted with Bartlett Tree to conduct a Tree Inventory and Management Plan for all the trees on the property. Their 400-page report noted the location, species, overall condition, potential hazards, value and much more for every tree. Overall, Bartlett assessed 1,425 trees, identified 47 species and estimated the total value for all trees at \$2,646,690.52. We will use this Management Plan over the next 5 years to prioritize tree removals, identify trees that need pruning or other health measures and generally use our budget in the most impactful way possible.
