

~ Directory and Emergency Contact Information: Please provide the Information Center with any changes to phone numbers, email addresses or names. Accurate information is key when we send out email blasts or other communication.



NO PLASTIC BAGS OF ANY KIND SHOULD BE LEFT IN OR AROUND THE BINS.

~ Brightview: Workers will continue to clean up Homeowner beds and common areas removing leaves, cutting grasses and perennials throughout the Spring. Brush hogging of the meadow areas will begin as weather and ground conditions allow. If we receive snow fall more than 2", Brightview will be out to clear the asphalt streets, all driveways and front walks and one side of the public sidewalks on Pembrooke and Nottingham. If you wish to apply a product for traction to your driveway or front walk, please use a non-salt product like Ice Melt or kitty litter. The HOA does not apply any type of ice melt product to driveways or walks, so please be careful while outside in the winter weather conditions. Also, please report any snowplow damage to the Information Center by April 1st.

~ **Geese:** As the weather warms up, we will see more geese on the property. Per the Rules and Regulations, bird feeders are restricted to the rear Homeowner beds. No bird feeders or ground feeding is allowed in any Common Area. Avenbury Lakes has a monthly contract with Ohio Geese Control to reduce the number of geese that live here full time while not harming them.

~ Architectural Committee Requests: Items that need approval prior to installation are listed in Section M. Architecture in the Rules and Regs and can also be found on the avenburylakes.com website under the "Standing Committee" tabs - Architectural - Standards. As a reminder, approvals are needed for: satellite dishes, security lights, fences, awnings, handrails, generators, window sash replacement, sola tubes, overhead garage doors and basement window wells. The Committee members are very quick to respond to requests and can answer any question you may have. We also strongly discourage the use of nails or screws through vinyl siding or metal siding trim for any reason.

~ **Metal Recycling Event:** Due to unforeseen circumstances, the annual April event has been **canceled** for 2021. Hopefully, we will be able to continue in 2022.

NOTE: Spirit and Volunteer Awards will **not** be awarded this year due to the pandemic. Hopefully, things will be back to normal next year and we will continue this Avenbury Lakes tradition.




Monday Morning Bible Study

Notes:

- (where possible) and is scheduled biweekly. Hand weeding and spot spraying with post-emergent herbicides will be performed in accordance with the service schedule in beds, tree rings, and the gravel walking paths. 1. Mowing service is a weather based service planned as weekly visits during the anticipated growing season, and can be changed due to extremes (wet and dry weather). Wetlands mowing is 3' on each side of the path North Slope inside the fenced area of the pool will be trimmed weekly following the mow schedule. Pond Bank mowing is for North and South ponds.
- 2. Fertilization includes 3 Rds of Turf.. Grub Control /Surface Insect control in Rd 2 is an added cost.
- Shrubs are inspected within the base contract, however treatment of pests and diseases are an added cost if needed and/or requested.
- 4. Hard Edging of sidewalks/driveways occurs on Pembrook and Nottingham, and alternates each week during the mow season, resulting in a full occurrence completed every 2 weeks. Vertical Trimming (soft edging) of beds 3. Fall Cleanup will occur as weather permits for leaf cleanup and perennial detail. Ornamental grasses are cut down in early spring, typically in February. Board approved early start to grass cutback for 2021 in January. includes all homes and will be completed by alternating the north and south sides of Middleton each week, resulting in a full occurrence completed every 2 weeks.
 - 5. Invasive weeds are treated during the growing season on an as needed basis. Treatment of Phragmites is an added cost if treatment is requested.
 - 6. Seasonal color program is an added cost to the base maintenance price.
 - 7. Mulching has been removed from contract in 2021.




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
