The Ohio Condominium Act and Ohio Planned Community Act both require associations to collect <u>assessments</u> from owners for common expenses. Despite the language in the laws, many associations, including Avenbury Lakes HOA, improperly refer to their monthly assessments as "maintenance fees" even though many items covered by the fee such as management, insurance, and a recurring Reserve Study have nothing to do with maintenance per se. In an effort to indicate the broad scope of items covered by the monthly fee, this HOA Board will use the proper term, "assessment" going forward.

Avenbury Quilt Club Christmas Quilt Raffle



Community Manager Report

~ Election Day: Tuesday November 2, 2021, is Election Day. The Lodge Activity Room is no longer the voting location for Avenbury residents. The new voting location is Hope Christian Church at 32625 Detroit Road, Avon, OH 44011. Don't forget to VOTE!!

~ Town Hall Meeting: We WILL hold an in-person Town Hall Meeting this year in the Lodge on Monday, November 15, 2021 at 7:00 PM. We will review the 2021 Budget and present the 2022 Budget including operating expenses, reserve expenditures and assessments. Residents are encouraged to wear masks and to socially distance. The Board will be available to answer your questions. Written budget materials will also be sent out to all residents the week of Nov. 22, 2021.

- ~ Brightview updates: Leaf cleanup will be taking place through the end of the year. Every effort will be made to remove leaves from the property, however, in some areas small amounts may be mulched by the mowers and some leaves may be blown into natural areas. All irrigation systems should now be shut off for the winter. Activities will begin in preparation of winter snow removal in December including the placement of snow stakes. Turf repair/re-seeding will take place in the spring of 2022 in some areas. As always, please contact the Information Center (937-9441) if you have any questions or concerns regarding landscape or snow issues.
- ~ Snow removal activities: Just a reminder that as we move into winter, please remove ALL items from driveways, front porches, and walkways. This will prevent items from being damaged by snow removal equipment. If you are putting up holiday decorations or lighting, remember that the snow may cover extension cords to those items creating a hazardous situation for snow removal crews.
- ~ Gutter Cleaning: Our contractor, Rolling Thunder, will begin to clean gutters for those on the gutter cleaning list as soon as the weather allows, and most leaves have fallen. Sometimes work has extended late into the year, but they will be completed.
- ~ Dog Licenses: Please be aware that all dogs MUST have a valid license for 2022 by January 31, 2022. Licenses are available at Drug Mart, The Rock Pile, and many local animal shelters.
- ~ Paint Colors: If you are thinking about re-painting your front or rear primary doors, come into the Information Center to get paint samples that have already been approved by the Architectural Committee. You do not need approval for this activity if you use these colors and there are many to choose from.
- ~ RV Lot Parking Reminder: The parking lot is an amenity intended for the use of Avenbury Lakes owners and occupants. It can also be used by guests upon request. Please fill out a Rental Agreement Form to rent a parking space. All vehicles, trailers, RVs, and boats must have a current license plate, have insurance and be registered to an Avenbury owner/occupant. For more details, please refer to Section R in the Rules and Regulations Handbook.
- ~ Abitibi Paper/Cardboard Recycling Bins: There are 3 bins for the recycling of paper and cardboard ONLY, in the RV Lot. Do not drop off Styrofoam, bubble wrap or anything other than paper or cardboard. To maximize space for all those using the bins, please break down cardboard boxes prior to placing them in the bins.
- ~ Trees: Just a reminder that trees located in the Homeowners mulch bed are the responsibility of the Homeowner. This includes tree trimming. Trees located in common areas are the responsibility of the HOA.
- ~ Outdoor Pool Petition: Several Avenbury residents recently presented the Board with a Petition to extend the Outdoor Pool hours to 12-8PM, seven days per week. The Board considered the request but declined to change the hours for the following reasons:
- Attendance after 6PM monitored in 2014, 2016, 2017 and 2018 showed that an average of 2 people used the pool
 after 6PM.
- With longer hours, 2 Lifeguards would be needed instead of 1 with the current hours (12-6PM).
- There is a nationwide shortage of Lifeguards, making it more difficult to find certified Lifeguards. This presents an opportunity for residents to fill these positions!
- Residents can use the Indoor Pool and then enjoy the outdoor pool deck if they like.
- The HOA plans and budgets for the Outdoor Pool to be open 7 days a week, however, if Lifeguards are not available from our contractor, we cannot legally operate the pool. That is what happened in 2021.
- ~ Trees: Just a reminder that trees located in the Homeowners mulch bed are the responsibility of the Homeowner. This includes tree trimming. Trees located in common areas are the responsibility of the HOA.

Landscape News

I know it is hard to believe with the great October weather that we had,

but winter is fast approaching. There is still work to be done in the yard, including the removal of all annuals, that had such a good year, even with the heat. If over this past year, you did some landscape improvements those tender new plants need some protection especially in the root area. A burlap wrap is good for the shrubs and of course a little mulch around the base of the shrub will protect the root system. Both will protect your new and nearly new plants from snow damage and burning of foliage from the cold winds. If you have not cut back all your perennials some of those will help to feed the birds with their seed pods.

We hope all of you were treated to a sighting of the baby deer that were born on our property. They are majestic. They do have an evil side however, when they nibble all winter long on the shrubs and lawns. However they do a great service of eating the acorns that are plentiful this year and help to keep them out of the turf areas.

You need to take advantage of making a few cuttings from your ornamental shrubs and add them to your Thanksgiving decorations. If they survive, add them to your Christmas arrangements. These cuttings will do little harm to your established shrubbery.

The Landscape Committee would also like to thank the residents for their continued patience with the committee in making the best decisions for the community. We are your neighbors and we are working hard to make this the best community for all of us to live in. We will need your continuous patience as we venture out to a new year with more challenges. Hopefully we will be able to resume our activities with less fear and more resolve.

IMPORTANT REMINDER from Landscape Committee

If you have Bunny grasses in the 3 foot area around your home, feel free to dig them up and dispose of them. They are no longer on the approved plant list as they are very invasive. They will reseed themselves in your lawn area.

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
