

- ~ Directory and Emergency Contact Information: Please provide the Information Center with any changes to phone numbers, email addresses or names. Accurate information is key when we send out email blasts, other communications and when we re-print the Resident Directory later this year.
- ~ **Abitibi Paper Recycling Bin:** Thank you to all residents who use the paper/cardboard recycling bin in the RV Parking Lot! In addition to reducing waste at local landfills, Avenbury receives payment for material placed in the bin. Please place paper and crushed cardboard <u>ONLY</u> in the bin. <u>NO</u> PLASTIC BAGS OR STYROFOAM OF ANY KIND SHOULD BE LEFT IN OR AROUND THE BINS.
- ~ Brightview: Workers will continue to clean up Homeowner beds and common areas removing leaves, cutting grasses and perennials throughout the Spring. Brush hogging of the meadow areas will begin as weather and ground conditions allow. If we receive snow fall more than 2", Brightview will be out to clear the asphalt streets, all driveways and front walks and one side of the public sidewalks on Pembrooke and Nottingham. If you wish to apply a product for traction to your driveway or front walk, please use a non-salt product like Ice Melt or kitty litter. The HOA does not apply any type of ice melt product to driveways or walks, so please be careful while outside in winter weather conditions. Also, please report any snowplow damage to the Information Center by April 1st.
- ~ Geese: As the weather warms up, we will see more geese on the property. Per the Rules and Regulations, bird feeders are restricted to the rear Homeowner beds. No bird feeders or ground feeding is allowed in any Common Area. Avenbury Lakes has a monthly contract with Ohio Geese Control to discourage the number of geese that live here full time while not harming them.
- ~ Architectural Committee Requests: Items that need approval prior to installation are listed in Section M. Architecture in the Rules and Regs and can also be found on the avenburylakes.com website under the "Standing Committee" tabs Architectural Standards. As a reminder, approvals are needed for: satellite dishes, security lights, fences, awnings, handrails, generators, window sash replacement, sola tubes, overhead garage doors and basement window wells. The Committee members are very quick to respond to requests and can answer any question you may have. We also strongly discourage the use of nails or screws through vinyl siding or metal siding trim for any reason.
- ~ **NOTE:** Spirit and Volunteer Awards will not be awarded this year due to the pandemic. Hopefully, things will be back to normal next year and we will continue this Avenbury Lakes tradition.

#### Your Monthly Assessment at Work

Following up on the recommendations of the structural engineering firm we engaged to evaluate our wood bridges, we have:

- Totally replaced the boat dock;
- Installed a smaller fountain near the gazebo to minimize spray on the nearby bridge and replaced corroded post brackets with new, heavy duty brackets;
- Replaced handrails on the long bridge in the wetlands and mounted them on an angle to allow rain and snow to run off;
- Reinforced supports on the long bridge in two locations with a process called "sistering."

When the weather warms up a bit, we will schedule a few repairs to concrete post bases.

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
