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

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Landscape Committee News

• We made it!!!!! It is one of the best times of the year. Plants are starting to emerge and show their beautiful faces. It is time to pick your annuals and visit the garden centers to get ideas of color and structure. Now is the time to observe your perennials that are poking their head through the cold earth. We need to give them the granular long-lasting fertilizer that will feed them through the summer as we water. Please check all for disease and the emerging bugs that will use these as host plants to feed themselves. They are doing well and just a little boost from you is all they need.



- ◆ Annuals are the king and queen of the summer months. They will provide you with a punch of color you need. If you have prepared your beds early on with a long term fertilizer there is no need to add more when you plant your annuals. As we have discussed so often in the past, bed preparation is so important to the health and well-being of your garden. Too much nitrogen too soon and too often promotes excessive tender growth which attracts pests especially aphids.
- That brings us to why we need to be careful at this time and not get over zealous about getting the plants into the soil. Planting of annuals, in our region, should not start until after *May 15*, when all danger of frost has passed and the soil has had a chance to warm.
- Another mistake we all make is planting in the *wrong spot*. We need to examine the site we have chosen for sun exposure and soil conditions. Make sure you read all tags that tell you the amount of light a plant should get and the type of soil it should be planted in.
- Next, make sure that plants are grouped in *odd numbers*. Avoid planting in straight lines. That will add a natural look to your beds.
- Be careful of the *color palette*. Choose colors that stand out against the backdrop of your house. Light colored flowers in front of a dark house and dark colors in front of a lighter colored house.
- Do not leave open gaps of soil. These areas are an invite to weed growth, plus it looks unfinished.
- Lastly create a plan and seek advice where needed. With your cell phone handy take a picture of the area you want to plant and take it to the garden center for advice. You do not have to be a landscape architect to have a beautiful yard. Use your imagination and ask the people in the know. *Have a great planting month and stay safe and well*.

- <u>UPDATES</u>: Remember to check the website (avenburylakes.com) for the latest news including Pool Openings and Closings or call the Info Center (440-937-9441). <u>All dates shown</u> <u>below are subject to change based on weather conditions and other factors.</u>
- <u>INFORMATION CENTER</u>: We are back to regular Office hours (9AM-2PM, M-F) for phone calls, emails and walk-ins. Masks are optional. Forms for Work Orders, Landscape and Architectural Modifications are available on the avenburylakes.com website or can be submitted directly to the Office.



- <u>GUTTER CLEANING</u>: Spring gutter cleaning, for those on the gutter cleaning list, will begin in late May and continue into June. This service is weather dependent and occurs after tree blossoms and helicopter seeds have fallen, so dates are approximate.
- **<u>ROAD WORK</u>**: Cunningham Paving will be crack filling in all areas of Avenbury Lakes including parking lots, asphalt roadways, driveways, and walking paths. They will also seal coat Worthington and a previous repair made on Halifax, repair failed asphalt on Roxbury, Montague, the Lodge Parking Lot and part of Manchester. 6 catch basins will be replaced on Hathaway, Roxbury, Montague, Langford and the Lodge Parking Lot. When specific work dates are available, they will be posted to the website (**avenburylakes.com**) and all affected residents will be given flyers with important information regarding parking, time frames and other info. All work is weather dependent, so dates are subject to change, however, work is likely to begin the second week of May. As always, information will be available by calling the **Information Center (440-937-9441)**.
- <u>LANDSCAPE NEWS</u>: Mowing began in late April and will continue through the fall. Days and streets may vary depending on weather conditions, but the Gantt Chart included in this issue of the Breeze can be used as a general guide to Landscape activities. <u>Please do not use your irrigation systems</u> <u>24 hours prior to a mow day if possible</u>. The latest news will be posted to the website and residents can call the office with any questions.
- **<u>MULCH</u>**: Installation began in April and should be completed this month, weather dependent.
- **IRRIGATION SYSTEMS:** If you use a contractor to turn on your irrigation system, please make sure they thoroughly check the entire system! We have had several instances where sprinkler heads were buried under the ground causing very wet turf areas leading to damage from lawn mowers. The contractor should also check your timer. **Per Brightview, the best time to water is around 2 AM or 3 AM for about 10 minutes 3 days per week** (based on a typical year's rainfall).
- **<u>ROOF REPLACEMENT PROJECT</u>**: This year (Phase 6), 48 roofs will be replaced including, addresses 2002-2016 on Nottingham and all of Buckingham. The **TENTATIVE** start date for this project is early **May 2022**. Homeowners will be given flyers with detailed information prior to the beginning of any work and a letter regarding dryer vent issues. Information will also be available on the website (avenburylakes.com) and by calling the **Information Center (440-937-9441**).
- <u>LANDSCAPE BED REMINDER</u>: If you are re-doing your homeowner beds, please <u>submit a</u> <u>Modification Form to the Landscape Committee</u> if you are removing or adding a tree, removing more than 3 plants or have questions regarding the Approved Plant List.
- **<u>REMINDERS</u>**: If you are renting a parking space at the RV Lot and your term has expired, please contact the **Information Center (440-937-9441)** to pay for an extension. License plates must be current for all vehicles in RV Lot parking spaces.


