#### Community Manager Report



**Roof Update:** Phase 6 of the Roof Replacement Project has been completed. This year 40 addresses were completed on Nottingham and Buckingham. If anyone has any problems with the roof or roof related items in the future, please **contact the Information Center**. Final Touch will repair any damage to turf areas.

<u>Community Walk</u>: Contractors and AL staff will continue to follow up with repairs and other items identified from the Community Walk. Please remove any items placed in

Common Areas. Also, as a reminder, if you are changing something on the exterior of your home, you may need approval from the Architectural Committee **BEFORE** the work takes place. This includes satellite dishes, exterior lights, security cameras, solar tubes, generators, window well covers, step and porch handrails, storm and primary door replacements, garage door replacements, window replacements and other items. Forms are available online and at the Information Center. **Call us if you need clarification**. Failure to get prior approval may mean that the item must be removed, and repairs made at the homeowner's expense.

<u>Flag Policy</u>: As a reminder, the **Rules and Regulations**, **page 25**, #10 under Exterior Modifications, states that 1 United States of America Flag (not to exceed 3x5) is permitted to be displayed on a pole with bracket attached to the front exterior of the home. Please do not display other non-approved flags.

<u>Energy Audits</u>: If you are considering installing new windows, air conditioner, furnace or hot water tank, consider having an Energy Audit done first! Available through **Columbia Gas (call 877-644-6674)** for \$50, you will have an extensive in-home review of your home's energy performance, receive free products, tests and referrals to insulation programs and appliance rebates. Some may receive free services worth thousands of dollars depending on household income.

<u>Contact Information</u>: If you have changes to your Contact Information such as a new phone number, email address or Emergency Contact, please let us know at the **Information Center**. This information is helpful when we need to reach you and for the email blasts.

**Brightview:** Fall clean up begins this month and will continue till the end of the year, including leaf removal when the leaves fall. Mowing will continue through the month. <u>Irrigation systems should be turned off now.</u> Pruning will continue until **all** areas have been addressed.

**Pond Banks:** Work will continue on pond banks through the month. There will be one more thistle application and basin trimming. If the weather cooperates, the banks will be cut down for the season in late November.

<u>Sale of Homes</u>: If you are selling your home, please review "Section N. Sale of Units" in the Rules and Regulations Handbook. This section will answer most questions for Sellers and Real Estate Agents listing a home. Also, if you would like to post to the **Homes For Sale** section of the Avenbury Lakes website, please let us know at the Information Center. This is a free service for residents and generates a lot of buyer interest. You will need to turn in your Lodge swipe card at the Information Center if you have sold your home.

<u>Dock Handrails</u>: Handrails will be constructed this month on the North Pond Dock. The area can then be safely used for fishing or relaxing.

<u>Computer Changes:</u> Lawrence Management is switching to a new computer database system called Vantaca. In the coming months, we will provide you with more information about how to access the system, giving you more direct information about your account and maintenance requests. *Stay tuned!!*

#### Landscape Committee News

It's hard to believe that October is already here. Try to get out and enjoy some of the beautiful colors and cooler fall temperatures!

Thank you to those residents who attended the Q & A Landscape meetings. Hopefully some of your questions were answered.



There is still time in October to plant spring flowering bulbs. Daffodils and hyacinths do well in Avenbury. The rule of thumb is to plant bulbs in odd numbered clusters, approximately 3 times deeper than the height of the bulb with a little bone meal or slow acting fertilizer in the bottom of the hole. Water them well and enjoy the beautiful flowers in the spring!

It has been brought to our attention that some of our red oak trees have fuzzy orange balls growing on the leaves. You will be happy to know they are not harming the tree. They are actually leaf tissue stimulated by the grub of the **Callirhytis Furva Wasp** to feed and protect itself as it matures into a very tiny, non-threatening adult wasp. It takes an entire year for the process to complete so the gauls generally appear only every other year. They are common in northeast Ohio and there's an interesting video about them on YouTube.com "**Trouble with Tribbles**" by **Dr. Joel Duff**, a Professor of Biology at the University of Akron.


