Community Manager Report



~ Election Day: Tuesday November 8, 2022, is Election Day. <u>The Lodge</u> <u>Activity Room is no longer the voting location for Avenbury residents</u>. The new voting location is Hope Christian Church at 32625 Detroit Road, Avon 44011. **Don't forget to VOTE!**

~ Town Hall Meeting: We <u>WILL</u> hold an in-person Town Hall Meeting this year in the Lodge on Monday, November 14, 2022 at 7:00 PM. We will review the 2022 Budget and present the 2023 Budget including operating expenses,

reserve expenditures and assessments. The Board will be available to answer your questions. Written budget materials will also be sent out to all residents the week of Nov. 21, 2022.

~ Brightview updates: Leaf cleanup will be taking place through the end of the year. Every effort will be made to remove leaves from the property, however, in some areas small amounts may be mulched by the mowers and some leaves may be blown into natural areas. All irrigation systems should now be shut off for the winter. Activities will begin in preparation of winter snow removal in December including the placement of snow stakes. Turf repair/re-seeding will take place in the spring of 2023 in some areas. As always, please contact the Information Center at (937-9441) if you have questions or concerns regarding landscape or snow issues.

~ Snow removal activities: Just a reminder that as we move into winter, please remove ALL items from driveways, front porches, and walkways. This will prevent items from being damaged by the snow removal equipment. If you are putting up holiday decorations or lighting, remember that the snow may cover extension cords to those items creating a hazardous situation for snow removal crews.

~ **Gutter Cleaning:** Our contractor, Rolling Thunder, will begin to clean gutters for those on the gutter cleaning list as soon as the weather allows, and most leaves have fallen. Sometimes work has extended late into the year, but they will be completed.

~ **Dog Licenses:** Be aware that dogs <u>MUST</u> have a valid license for 2023 by January 31, 2023. Licenses are available at Drug Mart, The Rock Pile, and many local animal shelters.

~ **Paint Colors:** If you are thinking about re-painting your front or rear primary doors, come in to the Information Center to get paint samples that have already been approved by the Architectural Committee. You do not need approval for this activity if you use these colors, and there are many to choose from.

~ **RV Lot Parking Reminder:** The parking lot is an amenity intended for the use of Avenbury Lakes owners and occupants. It can also be used by guests upon request. Please fill out a Rental Agreement Form to rent a parking space. All vehicles, trailers, RVs, and boats must have a current license plate, have insurance and be registered to an Avenbury owner/occupant. For more details, please refer to Section R in the Rules and Regulations Handbook.

~ Abitibi Paper/Cardboard Recycling Bins: There are 3 bins for the recycling of paper and cardboard ONLY, in the RV Lot. Do not drop off styrofoam, bubble wrap or anything other than paper or cardboard. To maximize space for all those using the bins, please break down all cardboard boxes prior to placing them in the bins.

~ **Trees:** Just a reminder that trees located in the Homeowners mulch bed are the responsibility of the Homeowner. This includes tree trimming also. Trees that are located in common areas are the responsibility of the HOA.

Landscape News

Another summer has come and gone and the cold of winter is fast approaching. Before long the snow will be flying and all of us will be snuggled up in our homes.



By now you have probably cleaned out your annuals and cut back your perennials. However, you may decide not to cut back the black-eyed susans and cone flowers and let the birds enjoy the seeds during the winter.

Avenbury is now about 20 years old. Many of the original shrubs in the areas attached to our homes have become overgrown and woody. Some of us are thinking about having them removed and replaced. Winter is the time to start thinking about what you would like to change. Use our approved plant list to make your decisions. Dwarf shrubs and trees might be easier to maintain through the years in our small beds. As always, a landscape request must be submitted and approved before you start a project.






