BOARD PRIORITIES FOR 2023

When setting goals for the coming year, the HOA Board will continue to do so with these intentions:

- Insure prudent use of all funds;
- Maintain the appearance of this community;
- Minimize for residents the impact of increasing costs; and
- Enhance efficiency of community operations.
- 1. Continue with Phase VII of the re-roofing project to include 20 homes on Charles Ct. and Hathaway Ct.
- 2. Continue monitoring and management of the basin embankments in accordance with the original design.
- 3. Maintain and enhance communication for community-wide landscape and snow removal activities.

4. Continue the tree management program with the goal of proactively reviewing the health of community trees to avoid costly losses and replacements.

5. Renew and enhance common landscape areas.

6. Move forward with staining and repairing of the wooden bridges, now that the dock is completed with the addition of rails.

> 7. Replace/repair the indoor pool deck to correct the spalling of concrete into the pool.

8. Monitor COVID restrictions and guidelines and adjust accordingly.

9. Plan a virtual Annual Meeting for late April 2023.

COMMUNITY MANAGERS REPORT

- **SOLICITATION:** If you do not want to answer the door to salespeople, please contact the City of Avon and register your address as "NO SOLICITATION". They will give you a sticker to attach to your front door stating, "NO SOLICITATION". If a salesperson ignores the sticker, you should report them to the Avon Police Department. The Lodge and Information Center are "No Solicitation" areas.
- **COUPON BOOK:** If you no longer want to use a coupon book to pay your monthly HOA fee, please call **Jennifer** at Lawrence Community Management Group **(440-225-2704)**, to find out how to set up an automatic payment plan. Coupon Books are still available at a cost of \$15. This is a cost saving measure for all Avenbury residents as it reduces an HOA expense.
- 2023 MONTHLY HOA FEES: As previously noted, the fee will be increased \$10.00 beginning January 1, 2023. If you have Auto Pay through your bank, you must notify them of the increase to avoid late fees. If you have Auto Pay through Lawrence Community Management Group, the fee will automatically be increased, and you do not have to do anything.
- SNOW REMOVAL: For the latest news, please check the Avenburylakes.com website or call the **Information Center M-F before 2PM (440-937-9441)**. Snow fall must exceed 2" before snow removal activities begin. Please DO NOT place Holiday decorations including extension cords where they may be damaged by snow removal equipment. This includes front walks, porches, driveways and driveway edges. Brightview will make every effort to clear the snow as soon as possible. In the event of a large snowstorm, it may take more than one day to clear snow in all areas.
- NEW ROOF INSURANCE DISCOUNT: Check with your insurance company to see if they offer a discount for a new roof. Several residents have told us that they have received this. The insurance company may need documentation and we may be able to provide the required proof. Find out what they need and contact the **Information Center**.
- HOA ANNUAL MEETING: We are planning the Avenbury Lakes Homeowners Association Annual Meeting for April 2023. More details will be coming regarding Board Position Nominations, volunteer opportunities, and the location/configuration of the meeting. Stay tuned!!!
- **LODGE PAINTING:** In January, Patton Painting will be painting various areas of the Lodge. Thank you in advance for your cooperation and patience.
- **DOG OWNERS:** A new dog park has opened at Veteran's Park on Detroit Rd. in Avon Lake.

• Please pay for each event SEPARATELY , either with a check or cash in an envelope.	
• If your name is on the Wait List, please <u>DO NOT PAY</u> until you are notified of being able to attend the event.

Crochet Group


