Landscape News

It seems that summer is finally here. The garden centers have a very nice assortment of perennials and annuals. After a cool May, it should be safe to plant the annuals. Even without a garden plot, many of us have grown our own herbs and vegetables in pots on our patio. It is wonderful to enjoy our own fresh vegetables toward the end of summer.

The steps to follow for any plans you may have for a landscape change are:

- ~ If you plan to replace 3 or more shrubs or remove or plant a tree, you must submit a Landscape Modification Form.
- ~ Submit a drawing of the layout and exactly what plants and how many would be planted with the Landscape Modification Form.
- ~ Submit the name of the Landscaper.
- ~ Make sure all plants are on the Avenbury Approved Plant List.
- ~ You must have approval from the Landscape Committee before any work can be done.
- \sim Please allow 4-6 weeks for your request to be approved.

The mowing schedule will vary according to weather.

The Landscape Committee meets every second Wednesday morning of the month. Your approval time may be shortened if you submit it before our monthly meeting.

The Landscape Committee has decided to have another **Community Wide Q&A Meeting** for all new and old residents. We hope that we will be able to answer any of your questions. This will be held at the Lodge on Thursday, June 15, 2023 at 1:30 PM. Hope to see you there. Enjoy the warmer days!

COMMUNITY MANAGER UPDATES

- As of this writing, we are looking for a **Summer Helper**. This is a good outside summer job for a High School or College student. Please call the **Information Center** for more details.
- <u>Trespassers</u>: If you see unauthorized people on the property, for example in the Wetlands or fishing at the pond, please contact the Information Center and report it immediately. On evenings and weekends, contact the **Avon Police Department (440-934-1234)**. They will send an officer out & check ID's. They get a warning the first time and their name is placed on a list. Tickets are issued for repeat offenses.
- <u>Wyndham Hotel</u>: If you are hosting summer or Holiday visitors, remember that Wyndham offers a **10% discount** for Avenbury Lakes residents and their visitors. Make sure you mention Avenbury when making reservations (440-517-4124). There is also a link on the <u>avenburylakes.com</u> website.
- <u>Brightview News:</u> Mowing is continuing weekly. Feel free to call the **Information Center** with any questions or complaints. Remember the schedule is subject to change based on the weather. Fertilization, grub treatment, and weed control products including for thistle, were applied in May. Another thistle application will be applied soon and the pruning of new plant growth will also begin. Maintenance continues on the Pond banks per the plan devised with Doug Baldi, Landscape Architect. Other areas will receive enhancements and re-seeding as needed.
- **<u>Roof Replacements</u>**: Final Touch, our roofing contractor, began replacements in May on Charles Court. Once this area is complete, replacements will be completed on Hathaway. Residents affected have received flyers and letters with specific instructions. Please stay away from work areas while the crews are on the property. Updates will be posted to the website and residents can call the Information Center with any questions.
- <u>Street Work:</u> Cunningham Paving will do crack filling on all asphalt surfaces, seal coat the Lodge and Tennis Court parking lots including re-striping, and replacing several catch basins, beginning in July. We will contact those affected when more information is available.
- **Other work:** Aqua Doc is treating the ponds weekly for algae growth and clearing inlet and outlet pipes. Water levels will vary depending on rainfall.
- **Bridge Painting:** Patton Painting will prepare and paint the 3 bridges at the north pond beginning in late July. More information will be coming.
- <u>Maintenance Forms</u> or complaints should be in writing and either sent via email or given to the Information Center.
- Please see the <u>Volunteer Form</u> included in this issue of the Breeze. If you would like to join a committee, continue to serve on a committee or no longer serve on a committee, <u>return the form</u> <u>to the Information Center by June 15, 2023</u>. A new list of Committee Volunteers will be published in the July Breeze. Thank you for your participation!
- Outdoor Pool: If you plan to bring guests to the pool this summer, remember to buy your Guest Passes from Patty at the Lodge prior to using the pool. Passes are available as a card of 11 visits for \$20. If you would like to purchase fewer than 11, it is \$2 per guest/per visit. <u>Please have exact change.</u>





POOL HOURS: The <u>Outdoor Pool opens Saturday May 27, 2023</u>, weather permitting. The hours will be the same as last year: **Sunday, Monday, Wednesday, Friday, Saturday** from 12:00 - 6:00 PM and **Tuesday, Thursday** from 2:00 - 8:00 PM.

OUTDOOR POOL GUEST PASSES: The pool is open to guests (up to 6 guests per household, per visit). *<u>Residents need to purchase a</u> <u>Guest Pass from the Lodge Administrator PRIOR to May 27, 2023.</u>

PASSES WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE FOR PURCHASE AT THE OUTDOOR POOL. YOU MUST PURCHASE PASSES AHEAD OF YOUR VISIT. The pass includes 11 visits for \$20. Each guest would use 1 pass per visit. Residents do not need a pass to use the pool, only their guests.

All residents <u>MUST SIGN & RETURN</u> the LAVENDER Pool Regulation Agreement form so they understand the rules prior to using the pool. <u>Please return this Agreement to the Lodge and put into the box placed</u> <u>there for that purpose</u>. All signed Agreements will be retained as proof that each resident agrees to abide by the rules. As a reminder, the rules will be posted on a large sign near the entry gate and also near the door to the restrooms. A table on the Outdoor Pool deck will have a *daily Attendance Sheet* <u>TO BE SIGNED by each</u> <u>resident and guest using the pool that day.</u> Thank you in advance for your cooperation!
