SIGN-UP AND PAYMENT PROCEDURES FOR ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS

Avenbury Lakes has many wonderful events, clubs, parties, and classes to enjoy. It is important that the process of signing up and paying for these events go smoothly. To ensure that everyone has an opportunity to participate in these community events, the following rules are in effect:

1) New sign-up sheets will be placed in the Activity Book on the first of each month. The sign-up sheets are placed by date in the Activity book. Find the activity sheet you are looking for in the indexed Activity Book.

2) Sign one name per line, couples are not to be listed on a single line.

3) Payment for an event is required at the time you sign-up. Your payment holds your reservation. There will be a <u>cut-off date</u> for receiving payment for each event. There will also be a cut-off date for refunds if you are unable to attend.

4) The committee will <u>NOT</u> call each resident when payment has not been received by the cut-off date. <u>Your name will be deleted from the list.</u>

5) When the maximum number of spaces have been filled on the sign-up sheet for the event, the

names are then entered on the Wait List. <u>Do not pay</u> if you are on the Wait List unless you are called by a member of the committee notifying you that there is an opening.

6) Payments can be made by cash or check. Place cash in an envelope marked with your name and the event for which payment is being made. If paying by check, place the name of event <u>on the</u> <u>memo line</u> and place the check in the box on the desk. An envelope is not necessary for a check.

7) All checks are to be made payable to ALHOA.

8) A <u>separate</u> payment is required for each event. No postdated checks will be accepted.

9) If an event calls for payment at the door, please do not place any fees in the box on the desk.

<u>TRIPS</u>

<u>All-Day Trips</u>

 All-Day Trips require payment in full to hold your reservation.
 Trip refunds can be made up to the deadline registration date.
 When all seats have been reserved with full payment a Wait List will be established for those interested in joining that trip.
 If reserved seats become available at the last minute, residents on the Wait List will be contacted in the order they originally signed up.
 Multi-Day Tours

1) Multi-Day Tours are customized and promoted by the Avenbury Lakes Travel Club for our residents.

2) These trips range generally from 4-15 days; include domestic and international travel; and consist of air, bus and self-drive destinations.3) All deposits and balances are paid directly to the sponsoring tour company.

4) Deposit/final payment, cancellation and insurance procedures are established by the tour company and vary for each trip.

Community Manager Report

• **Community Walk:** Staff will begin conducting the annual property review. We will be looking at the south side of Middleton this year, letting residents and contractors know of items that need attention. The annual property review is one of many ways we ensure Avenbury Lakes continues to look its best.



• **Mature Landscaping:** Avenbury Lakes is over 20 years old now. It may be time to consider refreshing and/or removing the plant material in your homeowner beds. Over time plants can simply outgrow the space they occupy and overwhelm the original landscape design. If you decide to update your beds, please call the Info Center and we can discuss the process with you, including filling out a form for the Landscape Committee to review. If you are planting or removing a tree, the *Landscape Committee and the Board must approve that change*.

• Thistle and other weeds: Brightview uses a sub-contractor, On the Other Side, to treat thistle, apply fertilizer and grub treatment at Avenbury Lakes. On the Other Side has been on the property several times already spraying the thistle. If you see the plant turning brown, it has been treated and is dying. If you do not see any brown on the thistle, please report the area to the Info Center for treatment.

• **Gas and Electric Line Protection:** Residents may occasionally receive an offer to buy service line protection for exterior gas and electric lines to your home. Before accepting this offer, please review your Rules and Regs Handbook, "Association vs Homeowners Responsibility Chart" under Utilities and Foundations. The HOA is responsible for repairs to gas, electric, sanitary and water lines located outside of the walls or foundation of your home. You as the Homeowner would not be charged for these repairs if they were needed.

• **Brightview Update:** The second application of fertilizer including grub control was applied in July. The next application of fertilizer will be in September. Irrigation systems for the common areas are running three times per week. Pruning of new growth will begin this month. As previously mentioned, this year there will be only one pruning. Spot killing of weeds will continue. 18 **Common Area beds** throughout Avenbury containing a CEI utility box in them, will be re-configured to allow required access to the utility box. In many cases this will mean vegetation will be removed from the bed.

• Work Orders: If you have a Work Order request, please fill it out on the Website and hit the "Submit" button. You can also print the form from the Website and put it in the slot at the front door to the **Info Center** or come into the office and fill it out. <u>Please **do not** leave Work Order requests for Patty Hales</u>, <u>Lodge Administrator</u>, <u>as an email or voicemail</u>.

• Autopay/Payment Coupon Books: Just a reminder that there is a **\$15 charge** for Maintenance Fee Payment Coupon Books. If you would like to switch to Autopay, please contact Lawrence Community Management Group at (440-937-2800) for details <u>no later than October 31st, 2023</u> for the 2024 Payment Books.

• Wetlands Z Bridge: The east (Jaycox side) entrance to the Long Bridge to the wetlands (Z bridge) will be roped off until late August. Please <u>DO NOT</u> use this entrance to the Bridge until the barriers have been removed. The sandy path to the bridge in this area is being used by an insect called the Cicada Killer. This member of the Wasp family digs holes in soft ground creating burrows where they store cicadas they have killed for their larvae to feed on. They are nearly two inches long and look fearsome, but rarely sting if left alone.

• **Mailbox Repairs:** This month will see a lot of work completed on mailboxes throughout the community! We appreciate your patience.

• **Outdoor Pool:** Please remember to list the number of guests you are bringing when signing in at the Outdoor Pool and to purchase a Guest Pass from Patty Hales at the Lodge.

• **Exterior Painting:** Patton Painting will be painting the three bridges at the North Pond, the T-bridge in the Wetlands, and the Springhouse this month.

• **Staff:** Please welcome Dale Forthofer, our new part-time Maintenance Tech! He started mid-July so many of you have probably met him already. Dale's name may sound familiar as the former owner/operator of Forthofer Security. We have been short staffed for quite a while and Dale has enthusiastically jumped in to help us out. Thanks Dale!



Landscape News

The end of summer is approaching quickly. The flowers are really showing their beautiful colors. The most important thing you can do for your flowers and lawns right now is watering. With the high temperatures, we need to make sure that watering is adequate and consistent.


Trees need extra water during dry spells. Place the hose at the base of the tree and turn on a trickle of water. This will allow the water to be absorbed by the roots.

The pesky weeds are also thriving. Try to remove the weeds as soon as possible in your beds. If the weeds are allowed to form seed heads that dry, the wind will spread the seeds to other places in your bed and turf areas.

Don't worry if your grass is starting to turn brown. Add some water and with the cooler temperatures arriving in the fall, the lawns will return to green and begin looking healthy again.




