 - 8) Replace the electrical box in the outdoor pump house.
 - 9) North Pond outlet pipes redesign.
 - 10) Refresh Avenbury Lakes wooden signs, phase 1.
 - 11) Hold a 25th Anniversary celebration of Avenbury Lakes.
 - 12) Plan and hold a virtual hybrid Annual Meeting on April 23, 2024.

COMMUNITY MANAGERS REPORT

- ~ <u>SOLICITATION</u>: If you do not want to answer the door to salespeople, please contact the City of Avon and register your address as "NO SOLICITATION". They will give you a sticker to attach to your front door stating, "NO SOLICITATION". If a salesperson ignores the sticker, you should report them to the Avon Police Department. The Lodge and Information Center are "No Solicitation" areas.
- ~ <u>COUPON BOOK:</u> If you no longer want to use a coupon book to pay your monthly HOA fee, please call **Jennifer** at Lawrence Community Management Group **(440-420-5320)**, to find out how to set up an automatic payment plan. Coupon Books are still available at a cost of \$15. This is a cost-saving measure for all Avenbury residents as it reduces an HOA expense.
- ~ <u>2024 MONTHLY HOA FEES:</u> As previously noted, the fee will be **increased \$15.00** beginning January 1, 2024. If you have Auto Pay through your bank, you must notify them of the increase to avoid late fees. If you have Auto Pay through Lawrence Community Management Group, the fee will automatically be increased, and you do not have to do anything.
- ~ <u>SNOW REMOVAL</u>: For the latest news, please check the Avenburylakes.com website or call the Information Center M-F before 2:00 PM (440-937-9441). Snow fall must exceed 2" before snow removal activities begin. Please <u>DO NOT</u> place Holiday decorations including extension cords where they may be damaged by snow removal equipment. This includes front walks, porches, driveways, and driveway edges. Brightview will make every effort to clear the snow as soon as possible. In the event of a large snowstorm, it may take more than one day to clear snow in all areas.
- ~ <u>NEW ROOF INSURANCE DISCOUNT:</u> Check with your insurance company to see if they offer a discount for a new roof. Several residents have told us that they have received this. The insurance company may need documentation and we may be able to provide the required proof. Find out what they need and contact the Information Center.
- ~ <u>BRIGHTVIEW UPDATES:</u> Brightview will continue with bed/leaf/perennial clean up and will cut down ornamental grasses in late January or early February depending on the weather.
- ~ INDOOR POOL REPAIRS: As of this writing, the Indoor Pool Deck will be repaired beginning the week of January 15, 2024. **THE POOL WILL BE CLOSED WHILE THE WORK ON THE DECK, POOL AND SPA ARE IN PROGRESS.** Updates will be posted to the website and signs will be posted in the Lodge. We appreciate your patience during this necessary repair.

FRIENDLY REMINDER

about signing up for events in the Lodge Activity Book:

- <u>ONLY</u> sign your name (& your spouse). Use a separate line for each name. Please <u>DO NOT</u> sign for another resident unless payment is made for that resident at the time of signing up.

- ♦ When paying with a check, write the name of the event in the memo area and insert the check into the payment box. Please *DO NOT* put the check in an envelope.
- ◆ Use an envelope for <u>CASH</u> only. Please write your name & the name of the event on the envelope, and have the <u>EXACT AMOUNT</u> because the Lodge cannot make change.
- Please pay for *EACH* event *SEPARATELY*, either with a check or cash in an envelope.
- If your name is on the Wait List, please **DO NOT PAY** until you are notified of being able to attend the event.

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What to Know About Required Minimum Distributions

Your 70s represent a time to enjoy the fruits of your labor, but there's still work to do. When you turn 73, you'll need to start taking one of the more complex and time-consuming aspects of managing your retirement income: required minimum distributions (RMDs).

Let's start with the basics:

What are required minimum distributions? A required minimum distribution is the minimum amount you must withdraw from your tax-advantaged retirement account(s) each year, including IRAs (traditional, SEP, and SIMPLE), 401(k)s, and 403(b)s when you reach age 73. You aren't required to take RMDs from Roth IRAs during your lifetime.

When do you have to begin withdrawing money? IRS regulations require you to begin withdrawing a minimum amount of money from your retirement account(s) each year by April 1 of the calendar year following the year you turn age 73. After that, RMDs must be taken each subsequent calendar year by December 31.

Why is this information important to you? Calculating the correct RMD amount(s) across one or multiple retirement accounts is complicated. If you miscalculate or fail to take RMDs from one or more qualified plans, you can be vulnerable to hefty tax penalties.

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




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
