AVENBURY LAKES ANNUAL MEETING

AND ELECTION 2024

The Board voted on January 14, 2024, to hold a mail-in-election and a Virtual Annual Meeting on April 23, 2024. Using the mail-in ballot, more residents vote giving us a better representation of the community. The Virtual Annual Meeting provides the convenience of watching from home, or if you do not have access to a computer, the meeting can be viewed on the big screen TV in the Activity Room. More information on how to access the Virtual annual meeting will be in the April BREEZE.

The Nominating Committee, consisting of P. Neidhardt, the chairperson, R. Mazurak, and R. Hirth, has been approved by the Board of Directors.

This year there will be two open seats on the Board.

- ◆ Larry Escalante's current term will end in April of 2024. He is seeking re-election.
- ♦ Susan Neiding's current term will end in April of 2024. She is seeking re-election.

Residents who wish to serve on the Board are encouraged to run for a position. A letter of interest or intent along with a one-page biographical piece should be submitted to the Information Center by March 6, 2024. Qualifications to serve as a Board member include being an owner of record and an association member in good standing (no delinquent assessments or outstanding rules violations). Candidate information and ballots, along with postage-paid envelopes for returning the ballots and an explanation of how we will maintain the secrecy of the votes will be mailed to all association members in good standing at least 35 days before the election results meeting.

On Monday, April 22, 2024, a three-member election committee, chosen by the Board, will verify and count the ballots. Then a special election results meeting will be conducted, via a video conference format that same day. Attendance at the election results meeting will be limited to a representative from our legal counsel, the Chairperson of the election committee, the candidates, the Community Manager, and the current Board Members. The results will be announced at the Virtual Annual Meeting, the next day, April 23, 2024, in the May BREEZE and on our website.


Silver Sneakers Exercise Class

Charitable Donations Can Remedy Your RMD Tax Burden

If you're over age 73, each year you must take required minimum distributions (RMDs) from your retirement accounts. Failing to do so results in a hefty penalty—25% of the amount you should have withdrawn; possibly 10% if the RMD is timely corrected within two years. But what if you don't need the income? 




