#### Landscape News



~ According to the weatherpersons we are in Spring in northern Ohio. Check all your tools and make sure that shovels are sharpened along with any cutting tools. Time to think about what you want to plant in your mulched area along with identifying those plants that you already have breaking through the soil. Take those sharpened pruners and examine your shrubs. Cut out any dead, dying, or diseased twigs or branches that have been damaged over winter.

- ~ Now to the soil. This is a great month to incorporate organic and slow-release fertilizers in your beds. Examine the soil and make sure any large clods of dirt are broken up and all debris is removed from the beds. You can also divide large perennials. If space in your garden is at a premium, offer them to your friends, neighbors, and family that may be interested.
- ~ Of course there are always some problems. In our community we have a great deal of wildlife that love to dine in our yards. Bugs start to emerge and feed on the tender new growth. Deer and rabbits feast on the new shoots coming from many of your shrubs and perennials. There are liquid deterrents that can be used that do not harm the plants. Check with your local garden centers for advice.
- ~ Avenbury is noted for being one of the most beautiful communities in Avon. Note the rules we have in place (on avenburylakes.com) to make sure it remains a showplace.
- ~ Please note that you must submit a Landscape Request to the Avenbury Office if you are planning a complete redo of a large bed. After it is submitted, it may take up to 6 weeks for approval. You may remove 3 shrubs and replace with 3 shrubs without this request. If you have questions or concerns, the members of the Landscape Committee are your source of help along with the Property Manager. There is a comprehensive list of plants, shrubs, and trees that was expanded in 2023 and approved by the Board of Directors.
- ~ Be aware that anything outside of the mulched area attached to the foundation of your home is considered "common area" and must not be touched by the homeowner without written permission from the BOD. This includes trees, shrubs, plants, turf and ornamental grasses. If in question, please consult with the Avenbury office, the Landscape Committee or the BOD. Any tree planted in the mulched area or the common area needs the approval of the BOD. Do not prune any tree in a common area. If there is a problem with a tree in a common area, let the Avenbury Office know of your concern.
- ~ Notice from the Landscape Committee and Brightview: Preen is used as a pre-emergent in your beds in the spring. Do not sow seeds for 90 days after it is sprayed. Your seeds will not germinate. (Please refer to the BrightView 2024 Schedule of Services insert.)

#### **SMOKE DETECTORS FOR THE GARAGE**

An Avenbury resident recently had a small fire in their garage which resulted in considerable smoke damage. A number of neighbors have asked about installing a smoke detector in the garage.

Most commonly available smoke detectors are not recommended for use in a garage. Dust and carbon monoxide from car exhaust often will cause false alarms.


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The Avon fire department recommends an ionization type heat detector installed above the door to the house. They do not seem to be available at the local stores, but on Amazon, calling up *fire detectors for a garage* will show an ionization type detector for about \$20.



#### **TOTAL SOLAR ECLIPSE TIPS**

The Avon Chief of Police, Daniel Fishbach, and the Avon Assistant Chief of Fire, Brett Bruehler, graciously visited our Lodge on Monday evening, March 18, to provide useful safety tips and information regarding the uncoming Total Solar Eclipse Event on M.



regarding the upcoming Total Solar Eclipse Event on Monday, April 8, 2024.

The key take-aways to be aware of are:

- ♦ **AVOID** travel on April 8! Stay home and enjoy the eclipse from the comfort of your own home. Get your groceries, fuel and medications well in advance of the weekend so you can avoid expected traffic congestion.
- AVOID unnecessarily calling the Avon Police about <u>city</u> street parking. Parking on Shakespeare, Nottingham, Pembrooke and Middleton is legal (non-fire hydrant side only). The police will have their hands full with the MAIN Avon thoroughfares.
- If outsiders are parking on the asphalt streets, please refrain from calling the police as trespassing will not be a high priority for them to respond to on this day. Asphalt streets can <u>NOT</u> be barricaded or blocked off for emergency access purposes.
- Cars may be used as barricades to block access to the Lodge and tennis court parking lot.
- It is not yet known if trash service will be rescheduled to Tuesday. Watch for updates on the Avenbury website.

# AVENBURY LAKES HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION NO PRUNING AGREEMENT

The Avenbury Lakes Homeowners Association (ALHOA) recommends all homeowners take full advantage of the pruning services contracted by the Board with our on-site Landscape Contractor. In addition to caring for all common areas the Landscape Contractor will perform in the foundation bed around each residential unit the following services:

- Pruning of new growth on shrubs during the growing season
   EXCEPTION: plants that require specialized care such as Roses, Hydrangeas, Junipers, Arborvitae, Mugo pines & Rhododendrons, which our contracted landscaper does not prune
- cutting and removal of **perennials** debris in the fall
- cutting and removal of grasses debris in the early spring

Homeowners who prefer to prune the **shrubs and deciduous trees** within the foundation bed of their unit for themselves must submit a signed copy of this "No Pruning Agreement" every year — stickers, tape, ribbons, and signs advising not to prune will not be recognized. Please note that the "No Pruning Agreement" does not apply to perennials and grasses which will continue to be cut by our Landscape Contractor per the schedule above.

In accordance with this agreement, the homeowner takes full responsibility for pruning the **shrubs and trees** within the foundation bed in a manner consistent with the ALHOA Landscape Standards as determined by the Landscape Committee. If the shrubs and trees in the foundation bed are not maintained in a manner consistent with the Standards, the homeowner will be notified that corrective measures may be taken and the homeowner will be **assessed the full cost of the service.** 

In the event that the home is sold, this Agreement will terminate, and the Landscape Contractor will again prune trees and shrubs in the foundation bed unless a "No Pruning Agreement" is signed by the new owner before May 1<sup>st</sup> of that year.

#### THIS AGREEMENT MUST BE RENEWED BY THE HOMEOWNER OF RECORD ANNUALLY BY MAY 1st.
