These residents have years of knowledge and experience in assisting with maintaining the look of your home including updates to the exterior, suggestions for contractors, and answering questions or offering other information. *Please remember that approval must be obtained from the committee before any purchase is made.* Do not be rushed by a convincing salesperson. Reputable vendors should know that you live in an HOA and that you must get prior approval. Most of the requests are handled within a couple of days and the paperwork check-list process is quite painless. ARCH Standards are listed on the website and at the Information Center. Landscape Committee

- ~ Many signs of spring have emerged and are filling our gardens. If your beds have not been cleaned out there is still time in early May to accomplish this necessary task. The spring bulbs, daffodils, hyacinths and tulips have mostly flowered and some of the foliage is turning yellow and brown. Do not remove these until that process is complete. That is the food for next years blooms. We know it can be in the way of planting and some even consider it an eyesore, but it is so very important not to remove it.
- ~ There is still plenty of time to fertilize your mulched areas with a slow acting all purpose fertilizer. Winter does a very efficient job of depleting the soil nutrients and they must be replaced.
- ~ May is the month for planting annuals as long as all danger of frost has passed. In our zone that is usually the third or fourth week. Keep up with the latest weather reports because you don't want to take a chance on loosing all those tender plants.
- ~ We had a great deal of rain in April this year but the soil dries fast. Watering of our grass areas and our planted beds begins. If the soil is still wet it will compact when picked up in a ball. Try not to walk in the beds at this time because your footsteps will compact the soil. The soil will be harder to plants and nutrients will not be able to nourish your plants.
- ~ Keep a watch for the spring pests and take care of any damage immediately. New growth is an attraction for all kinds of critters.
- ~ Houseplants can start to be moved outdoors if you like to do that. Two potential problems exist when this is done. Over-watering and under watering can easily become a problem. This is also the time to watch for insects to infest the plant and the soil. Light exposure is extremely important. Shade plants in shade areas and sun loving in sunny areas. Deer and squirrels can become a nuisance either by eating the plants or digging in the pots and exposing the delicate roots. Yellowing of leaves and leaf drop can occur due to stress. If cared for, this is a temporary problem and will resolve itself. Most of all have fun and enjoy your watching your beautiful plants grow and produce flowers and foliage. Enjoy the outdoors and this beautiful community we live in. Remember that plants are living organisms and need our attention and care.

Landscape Reminders:

- ~ There will be no mulch applied this year to our areas. If you wish to do your own, it must be *triple shredded and brown in color*. If you have any questions contact the office for advice.
- ~ Reminder: Do not touch turf or trees in common areas. If you see a problem or concern contact the office.

POOL HOURS: The Outdoor Pool opens Saturday May 25, 2024, weather permitting. The hours will be the same as last year: Sunday, Monday, Wednesday, Friday, Saturday from 12:00 - 6:00 PM and Tuesday, Thursday from 2:00 - 8:00 PM.

OUTDOOR POOL GUEST PASSES: The pool is open to guests (up to 6 guests per household, per visit). *Residents need to purchase a Guest Pass from the Lodge Administrator PRIOR to May 25, 2024. PASSES WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE FOR PURCHASE AT THE OUTDOOR POOL. YOU MUST PURCHASE PASSES AHEAD OF YOUR VISIT. The pass includes 11 visits for \$20. Residents do not need a pass, only their guests.

All residents <u>MUST SIGN</u> the Pool Agreement so that they understand the rules prior to using the pool. <u>Please come to the Lodge to sign the form, then put it into the box placed there for that purpose</u>. All signed Agreements will be retained as proof that each resident agrees to abide by the rules. As a reminder, the rules will be posted on a large sign near the entry gate and also near the door to the restrooms. A table on the Outdoor Pool deck will have a <u>daily Attendance Sheet that needs TO BE SIGNED by each resident and guest using the pool that day.</u> Thank you in advance for your cooperation!

SPA - HOT TUB

The temperature of the water in the hot tub is 104 F. When using the hot tub, please be mindful of the fact that you should not stay in the tub any longer than 10 to 15 minutes for the following reason; when the body is submerged in 104 degree water temperature, the body cannot sweat to cool, so to compensate, blood vessels dilate to cool the body and the blood pressure lowers. In response to falling blood pressure, your heart speeds up. Not a problem for healthy people, but if you have heart disease it can strain your heart.



WebMD

The CDC says water at 104 degrees Fahrenheit is a breeding ground for bacteria. Do not swallow any of the water, or get it in your mouth.



Below are the current Mission Statements of the five ALHOA Standing Committees:

ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

To establish and submit to the Board of Directors recommendations and suggested standards pertaining to home architecture to ensure the safety and security of the homeowners and their guests while still providing choices for owner selection. The intent of the standards is to ensure the marketability and value of all homes. No Home Owner is permitted to add to or modify the existing home structure in any manner not in conformance with the Avenbury Lakes Architectural Rules & Regulations and Standards without a recommendation by the Architectural Committee to the Board of Directors and written approval by the Board of Directors.

BUILDINGS & GROUNDS COMMITTEE

The committee serves as a cost-effective resource to assist the Avenbury Lakes Homeowners Association Board and Community Manager in maintaining the common buildings and grounds throughout our community. The committee (acting in an advisory capacity) monitors and evaluates elements of the common buildings & grounds owned by the Association. This includes the Lodge and Information Center, indoor & outdoor pools, lakes, roost & gazebo, wood bridges & walkways, docks, benches in common areas, tennis court, asphalt streets, and the RV parking lot & garden.

COMMUNITY FUND COMMITTEE

The Avenbury Lakes Community Fund was established as a way to show appreciation for a favor done, to celebrate a special event, or as a memorial remembrance of neighbors, friends and family members. The Mission of the Community Fund Committee is to evaluate and recommend an appropriate level of funding for significant projects that are not covered by the ALHOA, and which benefit our community at large.

LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE

The mission of the Landscape Committee is to help preserve, maintain and enhance the original natural, Prairie Design and overall landscaping look of Avenbury Lakes. No Home Owner or Occupant is permitted to modify, decorate, landscape or adorn any area, in any manner not in conformance with the Avenbury Lakes Landscaping Rules and Regulations without a recommendation by the Landscape Committee to the Board of Directors and written approval by the Board of Directors.

SOCIAL COMMITTEE

The Avenbury Lakes Social Committee will oversee the development and execution of various social activities for Avenbury Lakes Residents under the direction of the Avenbury Lakes Board of Directors. Working closely with the Activities Coordinator, the Committee will plan various get-togethers for the enjoyment of the Avenbury Lakes Residents, recruit residents to direct and support the activities and see that all activities are conducted in a fiscally responsible manner. The Committee will be open to input from all residents and attempt to provide an agenda of many different types

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
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
