Winter Events: Information and updates related to winter weather events will be posted on the community website, www.avenburylakes.com. This is also a reminder that snowfall must exceed 2" before snow removal activities begin. During any winter event, we encourage you to use caution when venturing outdoors. This is a reminder to avoid placing any Holiday decorations such as extension cords where damage may occur by snow removal equipment. This includes front walks, porches, driveways, and driveway edges. Brightview will make every effort to clear the snow as soon as possible. In the event of a large snowstorm, it may take more than one day to clear snow in all areas.

Ornamental Grass Pruning: Brightview will continue with bed/leaf/perennial cleanup and will cut down ornamental grasses in January, weather pending.

Solicitation: If you do not want to answer the door to salespeople, please contact the City of Avon and register your address as "NO SOLICITATION." They will give you a sticker to attach to your front door stating, "NO SOLICITATION." If a salesperson ignores the sticker, you should report them to the Avon Police Department.

Clubhouse Maintenance: Duraclean will come to the Lodge in January to clean the carpet in the activity room and spot-clean other carpeted areas. Our maintenance technician, Jeff, is in the process of repairing and replacing light outages.

Vantaca: What is it and why should I register?

Vantaca is your community's online portal, which Lawrence Management provides. While residents are not required to register on the Vantaca Community Portal, we do strongly encourage you to give it a try, as Vantaca offers many benefits to unit owners.



The portal allows you to easily pay your monthly assessment, view your personal account information, enter and track your maintenance requests, receive electronic notifications about Association events and other important messages, and more. If you have not done so already, it's never too late! For instructions on how to register, please reference the recent budget notice on the reverse side of the letter that was sent to you in the mail or feel free to contact the Information Center for instructions.

Reminder for Sign-up and Payment Procedures for Social Events

- New sign-up sheets will be placed in the Activity Book on the first weekday of each month.
- Sign one name per line; couples are not to be listed on a single line.
- Payment for an event is required at the time you sign up. Your payment holds your reservation. There will be a cutoff date for receiving payment for each event, and there will also be a two-week cut-off date before the event for refunds if you are unable to attend.
- The committee will NOT call each resident if payment is not received by the cut-off date. Your name will be deleted from the list.
- When the maximum number of spaces has been filled, the names are entered on the waitlist on the sign-up sheet for the event. Do not pay if you are on the wait list unless you are called by a member of the committee notifying you that there is an opening.
- Payments can be made by cash or check. Place cash in an envelope marked with your name and the event for which payment is made. If paying by check, write the event's name on the memo line and put the check in the box on the desk. An envelope is not necessary for a check.
- All checks are to be made payable to ALHOA.
- A separate payment is required for each event. No post-dated checks will be accepted.

Reminder: Required Withdrawals from Your Accounts

If you haven't yet taken minimum withdrawals from any qualified retirement plan accounts you may own such as 401(k) plans, IRAs (traditional, SEP, SIMPLE), 403(b) plans, 457(b) plans, profit-sharing plans, and other defined contribution, plans you'll want to prepare to do so to avoid a costly mistake.

Age 73 marks the point at which the IRS requires you to start taking minimum, periodic withdrawals from these accounts. These annual required minimum distributions (RMDs) are calculated based on your retirement account balance(s) and life expectancy.

You must take your first required minimum distribution by April 1st of the year following the year you turn 73. If you fail to do so, you'll face a 25% excise tax on the amount not distributed. However, if the missed RMD is corrected within two years, the penalty is reduced to 10%.

While the first RMD can be postponed until April 1st of the year after you turn 73, subsequent RMDs are due by the end of each year. Postponing the first RMD results in the need to take both the first and second RMDs by December 31st in the same tax year.


