Landscape Committee News

Spring has taken a long time to warm up this year. May is here and time to put on those sunshine smiles and begin to enjoy the warm weather. With the heat of the sun and better temperatures the soil is really starting to warm up and that is the sign to begin the planting season. The perennials are up and really showing growth. Our beds have been edged and it is time to replenish the soil

with naturals amendments or the granular type of fertilizers. Whatever you prefer.

If May becomes dry, watering is essential for both the newly planted annuals and the perennials. This is a must for all plants to survive and become strong to survive the hot days to come. Sometimes we forget about our lawns. If we want them to stay at their best, or close to it, watering is essential. We will never be a community of golf course lawns, but we can still be a community of well cared for yards and lawns, if we do our part.

In the Avenbury rules and regulations it is stated. "During the growing season each Owner/Occupant is responsible for adequately watering the lawn area on the owners lot or in the common area immediately adjacent to their unit. Owners /Occupants area also encouraged to water adequately the cul-de-sac across from their units as conditions warrant."

Residents must understand that in order for this community to look its best during the growing season, water is an important to the life of our trees, flowers, shrubs, grasses and turf areas. People that drive through our streets admire the open areas that surround our homes. It is our responsibility to keep it looking the best that it can be.

We know everyone is anxious to plant those annuals, but in this region it is best to wait until after May 15th. Stay up to date with the latest weather conditions. Don't forget to put a few lettuce seeds in a pot and grow your own salad. Add some radishes and experiment with some other vegetables. It is surprising easily to grow a tomato plant in a large pot on your patio.

Of course, anything that you plant must be in the correct spot. Read the labels for sun exposure, watering and fertilizing. Have a fun summer and enjoy your yard and this beautiful community that we live in.

If you are changing things in your yard, check to make sure if a formal request needs to be made before you begin your work. If you have questions or concerns the Landscape committee is available to help you.

The members of the Architecture committee have years of knowledge and experience in assisting with maintaining the look of your home including updates to the exterior, suggestions for contractors, and answering questions, or offering other information. The Outdoor Pool Opens Saturday, May 24- Weather Permitting!



<u>The hours will be the same as last year:</u> Sunday, Monday, Wednesday, Friday, Saturday from 12:00 - 6:00 pm and Tuesday, Thursday from 2:00 - 8:00 pm.

OUTDOOR POOL GUEST PASSES: The pool is open to guests (up to 6 guests per household, per visit). *<u>Residents need to purchase a Guest Pass from the Lodge Administrator PRIOR to May 25, 2024</u>. PASSES WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE FOR PURCHASE AT THE OUTDOOR POOL. YOU MUST PURCHASE PASSES AHEAD OF YOUR VISIT. The pass includes 11 visits for \$20. Residents do not need a pass, only their guests.

All residents <u>MUST SIGN</u> the Pool Agreement so that they understand the rules prior to using the pool. <u>Please sign the form enclosed in the Breeze and drop it off at the Lodge in the marked</u> <u>box.</u> There will be extra forms available at the Lodge. All signed Agreements will be retained as proof that each resident agrees to abide by the rules.

As a reminder, the rules will be posted on a large sign near the entry gate and also near the door to the restrooms. A table on the Outdoor Pool deck will have a daily Attendance Sheet that needs TO BE SIGNED by each resident and guest using the pool that day. Thank you in advance for your cooperation!

Spa & Hot Tub



The temperature of the water in the hot tub is 104 F. When using the hot tub, please be mindful of the fact that you should not stay in the tub any longer than 10 to 15 minutes for the following reason; when the body is submerged in 104 degree water temperature, the body cannot sweat to cool, so to compensate, blood vessels dilate to cool the body and the blood pressure lowers. In response to falling blood pressure, your heart speeds up. Not a problem for healthy people, but if you have heart disease it can strain your heart.

WebMD - The CDC says water at 104 degrees Fahrenheit is a breeding ground for bacteria. Do not swallow any of the water, or get it in your mouth.

Holiday Office Hours: In recognition of Memorial Day, Lawrence Management Offices, the Information Center, and the Community Lodge Offices will be closed on Monday, May 26, 2025.

Emergency Calls - Lawrence Management: This is a reminder for residents to be familiar with what repairs are the unit owners' responsibility. If you report an emergency repair to our after-hours team by calling Lawrence Management, and if the cause of the loss is later determined to be the unit owner's responsibility, you will be charged back for all costs incurred. The dollar amount charged by the vendor cannot be disputed at that time. We encourage residents to contact a vendor of their choice to make repairs.

Internet and Cable Installation: Your cable company is responsible for installing internet cables properly below ground level and avoiding leaving cables exposed. If internet cables are left exposed, they may be damaged by the lawn care company during routine maintenance. If this occurs, owners must contact the cable company directly and request that they return and make the necessary repairs.

Pets: This is a reminder that pets may not be left unattended, nor should they be tethered outside of a unit. Dogs must always be walked on a secure hand-held leash. Pet droppings must be removed immediately from private and common areas. Dogs must always wear a valid tag. Please report violators to the Information Center at 440-937-9441/ Animal Control at 440-933-4567.

Tree Maintenance: The community performs an annual inspection of trees by a tree arborist to identify trees that are deemed an imminent threat to people and property. Due to the cost of tree services, trees and limbs that do not pose an imminent threat may not be addressed immediately and may be addressed during a larger project.

Garden Bed Art: Please refer to the Community Rules and Regulations related to limitations on Yard/Garden art in private owner gardens. We also ask owners to refrain from hanging ornaments and bird feeders in the common area trees.

Reminder for Sign-up and Payment Procedures for Social Events

- New sign-up sheets will be placed in the Activity Book on the first weekday of each month.


