The pool is open to guests (up to 6 guests per household, per visit).

PASSES WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE FOR PURCHASE AT THE OUTDOOR POOL. YOU MUST PURCHASE PASSES AHEAD OF YOUR VISIT. The pass includes 11 visits for \$20. Residents do not need a pass, only their guests.

Pool Rules: All residents **MUST SIGN** the Pool Agreement so that they understand the rules prior to using the pool. There will be forms available at the Lodge. All signed Agreements will be retained as proof that each resident agrees to abide by the rules.

As a reminder, the rules will be posted on a large sign near the entry gate and also near the door to the restrooms.

A table on the Outdoor Pool deck will have a daily Attendance Sheet that **NEEDS TO BE SIGNED** by each resident and guest using the pool.


Pickleball Players of all levels are welcome to meet at the Avenbury Courts on **Mondays and Wednesdays at 6:00 pm - 7:00 pm.**

The Association will no longer be facilitating residents' interior repairs. Repairs to the interior of all units are homeowners' responsibility. It is also the unit owner's responsibility to schedule all repairs with a vendor of your choice, or you may reach out to volunteers such as NHN. The new process for submitting an NHN request is simple. Please visit www.avenburylakes.com, select **Caring & Sharing** at the top of the site, select **Neighbor Helping Neighbor**, and click on the link titled **Online Request Form**. Your request will be emailed directly to a member of the volunteer group. If you don't have a computer, you may ask a friend or neighbor to submit an online request on your behalf. Thank you in advance for your understanding and cooperation with this newly developed process!

Welcoming New Residents and Guests: As units in the community are sold and new owners move in, you may see many unfamiliar faces in the community. Please offer new residents and their family members a very warm welcome! With summer upon us, you may also see many young children in the community visiting their families. We ask that you always be kind!

Maintenance/Modification Request Forms: When completing the online Maintenance/Modification Forms, please be sure to submit a new form for each separate request. We do encourage residents to use the online form and attach all required supporting documentation and photos when possible.

Landscape Committee News

Summer is finally here! In July, the beds around your home should be looking healthy and the plants should be blooming. A water soluble fertilizer will help keep the plants healthy and blooming. Water is important if we have little rain.

As we head into the dryer part of summer, it is necessary to keep the turf grass near our homes watered. This will help the lawn stay healthy and discourage weed growth. As stated in the **Avenbury Rules and Regulations**, "**During the growing season, each Owner/Occupant is responsible for adequately watering the lawn area on the Owner's lot or in the Common Area immediately adjacent to their Unit. Owner/Occupants are also encouraged to water adequately the cul-de-sacs across from the unit as conditions warrant.**"



The second application of fertilizer will be applied the beginning of July. **This application includes grub control. In order to activate the grub control, your yard should be watered the following day.**

If you have an issue with your landscaping, please fill out a landscape request form and submit it to the office. This will make the Landscape Committee aware of the issue and hopefully be able to resolve it.

If you are considering a landscape change, please submit your request to be reviewed by the Landscape Committee by the **FIRST OF THE MONTH** in order to be placed on the agenda for that month's meeting. *Have a great July!*

Avenbury Lakes Community Fund

The Avenbury Lakes Community Fund was established as a way to show appreciation for a favor done, to celebrate a special event, or as a memorial remembrance of neighbors, friends and family members. Monetary donations of any size may be sent to the Avenbury Lakes Community Fund, 2122 Southampton Lane, Avon, OH 44011. An acknowledgement will be sent to the person being honored or to the family of the person being remembered as well as the donor. While these gifts are not tax deductible, they serve as kind expressions of gratitude and recognition and will help provide special enhancements to our community.

The Mission of the Community Fund Committee is to evaluate and recommend an appropriate level of funding for significant projects that are not covered by the ALHOA, and which benefit our community at large

What Does The Community Fund Do?

Since its inception in 2006, the Community Fund has provided funding for many projects that benefit all residents of Avenbury Lakes.

The Community Fund funded the materials to light our three bridges so that they glow at night, making our community warm and inviting, as well as providing lighted walkways. It also sponsors the summer concerts at the pool and the hot dog cookouts.

Other projects include:

- The art gallery system in the Lodge
- A warming oven for the Lodge kitchen
- Bistro tables and stacking chairs for the pool area
- Rockers and tables for the Lodge porch and pool area
- Large screen TV in the all-purpose room
- TV sets in the exercise room
- Trio of planters and annuals to brighten the pool area
- Landscape improvements at the pool and the front of the Lodge
- Landscape improvements along Middleton and Shakespeare
- Bookshelves, shutters and closet renovations at the Lodge
- The Avenbury Lakes signs at both ends of Middleton
- The original paver garden that turned into a fundraiser and continues to grow

How Does the Community Fund Receive Its Funding?

Our funding comes mainly from donations in memoriam or in appreciation for services provided by "Neighbor Helping Neighbor", the Landscape Committee or others in the community.

Other sources of funding are the purchase of engraved pavers for our paver garden and fundraisers such as the Avenbury Home Tour, the 50/50 Raffle and the hot dog cookouts at the pool.

Neighbor Helping Neighbor volunteers will provide assistance or, in some cases, only advice, to Avenbury Lakes residents. There is no charge, except for the cost of any parts used in a repair. Requests may take up to five days to respond to. **This is not an emergency service. In case of an emergency, call a neighbor or a professional.**

The new process for submitting an NHN request is simple. Using your phone, tablet, or computer, please visit www.avenburylakes.com (no password required), select **Caring & Sharing** at the top of the site, select **Neighbor Helping Neighbor**, and click on the link titled **Online Request Form**. Complete the Online Request Form, one request per form, and someone will get back to you within at least 5 days.

After much consideration and discussion, the NHN volunteers no longer feel comfortable installing windows for our neighbors. It was a difficult decision, but it was time.

Listed here are some of the simple household repairs NHN volunteers can do as a good neighbor. These are guidelines only. Not all NHN members are able to make all the repairs listed. There will be times when no one is available to do a particular job. If the work requested is something we will not do, the resident may need to call a professional to do the work.

- Repair or replace leaking faucets and sink stoppers or provide advice on other plumbing issues.
- Unclog stopped up sinks or toilets
- Replace toilet seals in the tank and under the tank
- Clean out the bathroom vents
- Replace smoke alarm batteries
- Replace smoke alarms with the recommendation that the replacement has a 10 year battery
- Replace porch, ceiling lights or garage light bulbs
- Replace light switches
- Repair inoperative doorbells and install Ring doorbells
- Garage doors – program remotes or align sensors
- Replace lower window lugs or provide advice on lower window issues
- Light gas fireplace
- Install peep holes
- Replace door sweeps
- Replace door frame weather stripping
- Align sliding screen doors

Some of the things NHN volunteers will NOT DO are as follows:

- Replacing windows or window glass
- Nothing on the outside of the house, except replacing light bulbs and cleaning out bathroom vents
- Installing grab bars
- Reseating toilets
- Painting or repairing walls or ceilings
- Replacing a leaking hot water tank
- Running phone or electrical wiring to a new location
- Hanging wall cabinets or kitchen cabinets
- Hanging pictures, curtain rods, or curtains
- Replacing or installing ceiling fans
- Move garbage/recycle containers to the end of the driveway

WE NEED MORE VOLUNTEERS, male and female, skilled and unskilled, to help with the requests. Often the most needed skill requires being able to climb a ladder to reach a light bulb or replace a smoke detector battery or just being a good go-fer.

ORIGIN STORY

Independence Day, also called Fourth of July, commemorates the passage of the Declaration of Independence by the Continental Congress on July 4, 1776. The Declaration announced the political separation of 13 North American colonies from Great Britain.

TIMELINE

July 8 1776 First effective celebration took place in Philadelphia. First public reading of the Declaration of Independence, after people were summoned by the ringing of the Liberty Bell.

July 3 1781 Massachusetts became first state to recognize the Fourth of July as an official holiday.

July 4 1801 The White House held its first Fourth of July party. 

July 4 1851 The first Horribles Parade was held in Lowell, Massachusetts. This parade is a comical send-up of a stuffy military organization called the Ancient and Honorable Artillery Company of Massachusetts or the "Ancient and Honorables."

June 28 1870 Congress made Independence Day an official holiday for federal employees who worked in Washington, D.C.

1938 Congress formalized Independence Day as an official paid federal holiday.

July 4 1960 The current 50-star flag debuted after Alaska and Hawaii became states in 1959. 


DID YOU KNOW?


The Declaration of Independence wasn't actually signed (except by John Hancock) on the Fourth of July—that's just the day the document was adopted by the Continental Congress.

One U.S. president, Calvin Coolidge, was born on the Fourth of July, in 1872.

Three U.S. presidents, John Adams, Thomas Jefferson, and James Monroe, all died on the Fourth. Adams and Jefferson died within hours of each other in 1826.

 There have been 27 different official versions of the U.S. flag, including the first one in 1777. All of the changes have involved the addition of stars.

 A popular myth holds that Benjamin Franklin proposed the turkey as the national symbol but was overruled by John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, who recommended the bald eagle.

Great American composer John Philip Sousa wrote 136 marches in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Some of his greatest hits were among the first to be recorded and mass-produced as phonograph records.

Every Fourth of July, the Liberty Bell in Philadelphia is tapped (not actually rung) 13 times in honor of the original 13 colonies.


