## SR 83 & SR 254 Intersection Project

**What's Happening First:** Crews are installing temporary pavement (3 to 6 feet wide) along the east side of SR 83, from 2265 Center Road to the Winking Lizard. This will allow for a safe work zone on the west side, where road widening will begin.

**Traffic Impact:** One lane in each direction will remain open throughout this phase—no full closures of SR 83 are planned at this time.

**Timeline:** Phase I of construction is expected to continue through early November 2025.

## UPDATE ON THE TASK FORCE COMMITTEE ON FACILITY MANAGEMENT

In March 2025, committee members selected by the Board were: Bill Baringer, Cheryl Courtney, Mike Gallagher, Russ Hirth, Liz Manning, Bob Peter, Ed Ries, Bob Sexton and Marty Wynne. Bob Sexton was elected chairman, Russ Hirth vice-chairman and Liz Manning secretary. Cheryl Courtney later resigned when she was elected to the Board.

The main purpose of the Task Force is to gather information about the physical building spaces and estimated cost-savings of possibly selling the current villa at 2122 Southampton being utilized as the Information Center which would result in consolidating all office staff operations at the Lodge and relocating the maintenance technician from the villa garage to a location within Avenbury Lakes.

All areas of the Information Center and the Lodge have been measured to obtain accurate square footage. Maps have been studied and square footage assessed. This includes all office locations, rooms, supply and storage closets, and maintenance areas such as the current garage and overhead storage in the villa. Other common spaces and areas within Avenbury Lakes were also assessed for the possibility of relocating the maintenance technician and tools.

A list of 18 possible options was developed for further review and study for possibly relocating the office staff operations and maintenance technician. This review resulted in a ten-page list of all the Pros and Cons of each possible option.

In June 2025, after 10 meetings and many months of in-depth discussions, the Task Force arrived at five viable options for relocating the office staff operations and maintenance technician. The five viable options were reviewed by the Board of Directors.

In July 2025, the Board approved the next step in the process for Board discussions to be initiated with an architect to explore the feasibility of these options. Meetings with the necessary city officials and contractors will take place over the next several months to obtain the required information, gather data, and summarize estimated costs to complete this study. The cost data will be added to a Cost Benefit Analysis Report as the data is received.

A summary of the final study with supporting details prepared by the Task Force and the Cost Benefit Analysis Report will then be provided to the Board for their review and recommendations.

### 2025 Outdoor Pool Deck Set-up Thank You





## Landscape Committee News

Hello Summer in Northeast Ohio with our ever changing climate. First, we had rain for two months that we thought would never end, and now the high heat and humidity!

For those of you that love summer and heat, have at it. Thank goodness the pool is open for business again!



Are you thinking about brown lawns, dry flower beds, and all those expensive flowering hanging baskets that need to be watered now twice a day? To protect the beauty of our landscaped areas, water deeply mornings and late evenings for at least half an hour, if no rain is predicted for two or more days. Don't forget to add fertilizer to those baskets for continuous blooms throughout the Fall. A money saving tip for next Spring, why not add flowering perennials to your baskets and planters then transfer them to your beds in Fall.

### **But, WATER, WATER, WATER!**

Time is fleeting, Fall is near, and cooler weather is on the way. Take a look around your home. Take photos if you can of what did, or did not survive the heat, chipmunks, voles, slugs, bugs, our resident deer and other critters. This can help you plan for next year!

So many of our trees, shrubs and plants are old, stressed, and have seen better days. They are now looking sad making our homes look neglected. Fall is a great time to replace dying, diseased plants and shrubs in your beds.

The function of the Landscape Committee is to help homeowners in any way possible develop the best plan suited to your wishes and needs. We are all here to help each other. We love our beautiful community and take pride in keeping it looking great!

Enjoy this beautiful time of year and know that the Office or the Landscape Committee is available to answer questions.

### **WATER GUIDELINES FOR SHRUBS & TREES**

Providing the right amount of water can be confusing, as plants lacking water and plants receiving an excessive amount of water can exhibit the same symptoms. Many people misinterpret a yellowing of leaves as a need for water. However in most instances, this is a sign of excessive watering or a need for fertilization. Excessive watering actually can leach or make unavailable, nutrients required for photosynthesis. Typically plants that are severely lacking water will begin to brown around the edges of the leaves. In severe cases, the furthest point from the roots will begin to suffer irreversible damage.

Here are some general watering guidelines:

**Turf:** 30 - 35 minutes per day, 3 days per week. With soil high in clay content it might be advisable to split into 2 cycles of 15 -20 minutes. This will allow the water to penetrate deeper into the soil rather than run off down into the streets. This will also help to encourage deeper roots.

**Shrubs:** Most established shrubs require only 6 -10 minutes per day 3 days per week. Newly installed container grown shrubs (container grown shrubs are grown in a combination of peat moss and bark) require this much water on a daily basis for up to 3 weeks during dry periods.

**Trees:** Most established trees should only need supplemental water during extremely dry conditions. Watering of established trees during these conditions can be accomplished by placing a hose near the base of the tree for 1 - 2 hours 2 times per week during dry periods.

**Newly Installed Trees:** General guidelines for newly installed trees would be along the same lines as shrubs, daily watering for 1 – 2 hours (time depending on type of tree). Please keep in mind these are very general guidelines and can vary greatly. Manual watering is meant to supplement Mother Nature and prior to watering one should be wary of previous recent weather events and predicted weather events.

Remember the general guideline for established plants and trees is the equivalent of 1" of rainfall per week.

## [Avenbury Lakes is a Conservation Community with a Prairie Design](#)

Residents sometimes wonder why they must consult the Landscape Committee concerning any new plantings around their homes, and some have been disappointed when the Committee denied their request to add a favorite flower or shrub. A few residents have complained about weeds growing among the tall grasses or questioned the “mowing” schedule. The answer to all of these inquiries is that Avenbury Lakes is a conservation community created in prairie design. When Joe Scaletta first began to consider options for this new planned unit development (PUD), he took his lead from the original farmhouse on the property. The Forthofer family home on Detroit Road dates from America’s prairie design period (1895-1930) and set the stage for both the housing and landscape designs. Joe worked with landscape architect Doug Baldi to develop a plan that would provide a soft, natural appearance and mature into an ecological, low-cost, low-maintenance environment.

Those of us who strove for years to make our bluegrass lawn look like a golf course may require time to fully appreciate a less structured landscape style. Perhaps we need to take a step back in order to gain a new and different perspective. Prairie design bears absolutely no resemblance to a fine-trimmed lawn and is much, much more than just tall grasses and a pond or two. It is a conservation plan, designed in accordance with EPA guidelines to encourage and maintain a natural balance of plant and animal life. Various types of native prairie grasses are a major component of the design for many reasons: they provide an interesting mix of size and color, serve as natural privacy barriers, prevent soil erosion, hold moisture, and thrive without chemical applications that can run off and pollute ponds and other ground water. The common areas of Avenbury Lakes will never look like bowling greens because the Declaration for this development, registered with the Lorain County Recorder’s Office, actually specifies prairie landscape.

The Landscape Committee, as a subcommittee of the Board, is charged with the responsibility of establishing standards that will maintain a consistent prairie design throughout the entire community. The Committee makes recommendation as to which plant materials should appear on the approved list and what the standards for mowing and other landscape maintenance should be. As you probably know from reading the Homeowners Association Bylaws, our Board has ultimate authority for managing the landscape and all other aspects of this community. While there may have been some non-prairie plantings installed before the management of Avenbury Lakes was turned over to our Board, those plantings will not be considered as precedents. In all its considerations, the Landscape Committee will strive to uphold an overall prairie appearance – not necessarily the individual preferences of homeowners. A consistent look will help maintain high property values and control future maintenance expenses.

For those of us not already familiar with a prairie ecosystem, here are some of the conservation characteristics of the native plants:

- They are perennials that come back year after year unlike most ornamentals that must be replanted every year.
- They are nearly free of disease and harmful insects and practically never require applications of fungicides, pesticides, or fertilizer; not only is this good for the environment, it saves considerable time and money!
- Once established, prairie plants develop extensive root systems that eliminate frequent watering and protect them from drought.
- Native prairie plants are generally resistant to very cold winter temperatures.
- The plants attract butterflies and other interesting insects, and provide valuable habitat for birds and other animals that live in grasslands.
- Unlike non-native ornamentals that tend to fade when the fall season arrives, prairie grasses become spectacular as they develop feathery seed plumes and turn varying shades of russet, yellow, bronze, and orange.
- Additionally, many prairie plants have distinctive features like red stems or peeling bark that make them attractive throughout the winter.
- Because of the considerable variation in their size, leaves, flower color, and bloom times, prairie plants may be used to fulfill a multitude of gardening objectives such as privacy, erosion control, moisture retention, noise and pollution reduction, and flood prevention.

As a bonus to the time, effort, and expense they save us, prairie plants also offer us a glimpse of our country’s past. Their use as food and medicine by Native Americans and pioneers gave rise to many interesting stories. For example, Rattlesnake Master has been used as a powerful antidote for the bite of the prairie rattlesnake; Compass Plant holds its leaves vertically in a north-to-south plane and helped steer travelers across the treeless prairies; Gaultheria tea is an effective pain reliever, Nepeta reduces fevers, and Monarda used to treat burns.

The choice of prairie plant materials originally selected for Avenbury Lakes was not, however, based upon folklore. The plants were selected for their suitability to this climate and clay soil and their compatibility to thrive with and enhance each other. The complementary root systems of the chosen wildflowers and grasses work together so that, as they mature, they squeeze out weeds. The chosen plants co-exist tightly knitted and develop into low-maintenance garden designs that require few chemicals and little work. Since nearly half of Avenbury’s 146 acres is green space, it’s both wise and cost effective to capitalize upon the natural behavior of the plants to do as much maintenance as possible for us. As an example, the 12” grass between lawn and meadow areas (“no-mow” grass) is a fine fescue that prevents chemicals used on the lawn from adversely affecting wildflowers in the meadow; it also provides good ground cover and will ultimately eliminate weeds in areas where the wildflowers may not establish easily. As the wildflower areas mature, they only require one mow in the spring to allow sunlight to reach emerging plants.

There are additional plants on the Approved Plant List shown above, from which homeowners who wish to augment their landscaping may select. All the perennials, grasses, trees, and shrubs on the list are indigenous to the American prairie – hardy but not invasive. They will complement the original landscape design without upsetting the ecosystem or creating additional maintenance requirements. Please remember to submit plans for any additions to the Landscape Committee BEFORE making a purchase or starting to plant. The Committee will review each plan for compliance with our community’s prairie design and submit a recommendation to the Board for final authorization. The review may take as long as 60 days to complete. This process is every resident’s guarantee that all landscaping at Avenbury Lakes will be maintained in accordance with the original prairie design and at consistently high standards.




