## Outdoor Pool Deck Lounging Policy

In accordance with the 2017 update to the Rules & Regulations, section U-19 permits residents to sit on the outdoor pool deck even when a lifeguard is not on duty.

The outdoor pool deck is open from the first Monday in May to the third Friday in October.

Pool deck access is only through the Lodge Activity Room, and only during Lodge open hours.

Residents are permitted to sit on the pool deck when no Lifeguard is present and signs are posted in accordance with county and state regulations. All pool perimeter gates remain locked.

All participants are to follow outdoor pool rules. No walking/sitting on pool/spa cover. Close umbrellas when finished lounging and follow all Avenbury Lakes Rules & Regulations.

## AMERICAN FLAG AT HALF STAFF POLICY



The Avenbury Lakes Homeowners Association and the Board of Directors values the service of our military personnel and first responders, especially those whose duty resulted in their ultimate sacrifice.

To honor those who have served our country, the Board has adopted a policy that requires the Lodge's American flag to be lowered to half staff every year on the following dates:

- Peace Officer's Memorial Day on May 15th
- Memorial Day
- Patriot Day on September 11th
- The first Sunday of October remembering Fallen Fire Fighters
- Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day on December 7th


In addition, when the President of the United States requests that the flag be lowered to half staff to honor the passing of a past president of the United States or for a national tragedy (e.g., mass bombing, mass shooting) as determined by the President, the American flag at the lodge will be lowered to half staff.

The Avenbury Buildings and Grounds Committee will coordinate these responsibilities on the above five (5) remembrance days and will monitor the proclamations set forth by the President of the United States to lower the American Flag to half staff for the prescribed period of time and execute the order as set forth in above.

# Reminder for Sign-up and Payment Procedures for Social Events

- New sign-up sheets will be placed in the Activity Book on the first weekday of each month.
- Sign one name per line; couples are not to be listed on a single line.
- Payment for an event is required at the time you sign up. Your payment holds your reservation. There will be a cut-off date for receiving payment for each event, and there will also be a two-week cut-off before the event for refunds if you are unable to attend.
- The committee will NOT call each resident if payment is not received by the cut-off date. Your name will be deleted from the list.
- When the maximum number of spaces has been filled, the names are entered on the waitlist on the sign-up sheet for the event. Do not pay if you are on the wait list unless you are called by a member of the committee notifying you that there is an opening.
- **Payments can be made by cash or check. Place cash in an envelope marked with your name and the event for which payment is made. If paying by check, write the event's name on the memo line and put the check in the box on the desk. An envelope is not necessary for a check.**
- All checks are to be made payable to ALHOA.
- **A SEPARATE PAYMENT IS REQUIRED FOR EACH EVENT. No post-dated checks will be accepted.**

## Reminder: Required Withdrawals from Your Accounts

If you haven't yet taken minimum withdrawals from any qualified retirement plan accounts you may own such as 401(k) plans, IRAs (traditional, SEP, SIMPLE), 403(b) plans, 457(b) plans, profit-sharing plans, and other defined contribution, plans you'll want to prepare to do so to avoid a costly mistake.

Age 73 marks the point at which the IRS requires you to start taking minimum, periodic withdrawals from these accounts. These annual required minimum distributions (RMDs) are calculated based on your retirement account balance(s) and life expectancy.

You must take your first required minimum distribution by April 1<sup>st</sup> of the year following the year you turn 73. If you fail to do so, you'll face a 25% excise tax on the amount not distributed. However, if the missed RMD is corrected within two years, the penalty is reduced to 10%.

While the first RMD can be postponed until April 1<sup>st</sup> of the year after you turn 73, subsequent RMDs are due by the end of each year. Postponing the first RMD results in the need to take both the first and second RMDs by December 31<sup>st</sup> in the same tax year.




